Street Division

- Completed asphalt pavement repairs at 1100 Briar Hill Cir.
- Removed brush in right-of-way at 1100 S. Greenstone.
- Marked six right-of-way locates.
- Leveled up the street with asphalt at 1400 S. Main southbound lane. This is a temporary repair until permanent concrete removal and replacement are possible.
- Repaired five potholes at 700 N. Main.
- Repaired asphalt pavement failure at 603 Villa Creek.

Utilities Division

- Water usage was 52.418 MG this reporting period, July 4-10, 2022, up from 49.01 MG the previous week. The daily peak water demand of 7.772 MG occurred on Monday, July 4. There were 0.0 inches of precipitation during this reporting period.
- There was an estimated water loss of 105,000 gallons, one hydrant was flushed, and eleven valves were exercised.
- Crews responded to six sewer calls and cleaned 5,650 feet of sewer line.
- Over ten right-of-way locates were completed prior to work by franchise utility companies.
- The Solid Waste Division received three calls with scheduling questions and ten complaints: four trash, three bulk, two brush, and one special collection.
- Five recycle bins were distributed to residents.

CIP Construction

• E. Danieldale Road Reconstruction and Utility Improvements Project (Main St. to US-67) – The City's contractor, Pavecon, continued removing the existing eastbound concrete beginning at S. Main St. Their subcontractor, M-CO, is working on the 18-inch water main. Other subcontractors continue to work on finishing the sod and 12-foot trail on the north side of the road.

• Forest Hills Ramps Reconstruction – The City of Duncanville and the Dallas County Planning & Development Department, via the federally funded HUD Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program, are reconstructing and improving the reinforced concrete ramps and sidewalks at four intersections in the Forest Hills Subdivision. The City's contractor, Northstar Construction, LLC, continued setting the concrete formwork and pouring the new concrete ramps and new sidewalk at the Freeman-Center intersection. Northstar is scheduled to install the new pedestrian poles and push buttons at the Freeman-Center intersection within the coming week.



The Highway 67 Green Ribbon Construction Project - Green Ribbon Project construction commenced on October 11, 2021, with estimated completion now scheduled to occur in July 2022. In addition to site and irrigation improvements, the contractor is installing piers for the Wintergreen Road monument and pouring concrete for the footings. Landscape planting is expected to occur this month.





• Fire Station #1 – Staff and BRW Architects completed the 100% Construction Drawings. CORE Construction, the Construction Manager at Risk, put the project out for bid. A "Subcontractor Outreach Event" was conducted on March 22, 2022, at the Senior Center from 4:00 pm-6:00 pm, and a Virtual Pre-bid meeting was held on March 24, 2022. CORE opened bids on April 7, 2022. Council approved the Guaranteed Maximum Price agreement in June 2022. Construction should begin in September of this year, with completion anticipated in September 2023.




Other Construction

- TXDOT I-20 Construction Cockrell Hill Rd. to Hampton Rd. TXDOT plans to construct new service roads and ramps from Cockrell Hill Rd. in Duncanville to Hampton Rd. in Dallas to include new bridges across US-67. Following City Council Resolution in August, 2021, TXDOT plans to relocate Cockrell Hill Rd. Texas U-Turn from the northeast side of the bridge (not desired) to the southwest side of the bridge (desired). The project was awarded at the beginning of December 2021. The Pre-construction meeting with TXDOT and the contractor was held on February 1, 2022. Austin Bridge & Road, the contractor, started construction in April 2022, with an estimated completion date of November 2024.
- ONCOR Line Work in the vicinity of the Downtown District ONCOR is planning electrical line upgrades along Daniel St., Main St., Center St., Freeman St., and Wheatland Rd. The upgrades will improve the electrical system's capacity in that area. Work is expected to start in Summer 2022.

 ONCOR Transmission Line Work at W. Camp Wisdom Rd. and N. Cedar Ridge – On July 29, 2021, staff met with ONCOR to discuss the upcoming project to replace transmission lines along Camp Wisdom Rd. The ONCOR contractor finished transferring the cables to the new towers along Camp Wisdom Road and N. Cedar Ridge Drive and removed the existing towers. They will be removing the tower foundations in the coming weeks.



FIRE DEPARTMENT

- The Fire Department responded to 151 calls for service in the past seven days, which included:
 - 104 EMS calls.
 - 9 motor vehicle accidents.
 - 1 brush fire in Duncanville.
 - 2 grass fires in Duncanville.
 - 1 building fire in Duncanville.
 - 1 road freight fire in Duncanville.
- The Department has one vacancy. One of our Driver/Engineers has taken a position in another organization. We will have another vacancy in two weeks for a total of two vacancies. Of our four new employees, two of the firefighters now count as staffing. The other two new employees will not be counted as staffing until they complete the required training and attend a firefighter academy. Two new employees are paramedics certified by the Texas Department of Health Services and will attend DeSoto's fire academy. The other two new employees are fire certified with the Texas Commission on Fire Protection and will attend paramedic school.
- The Fire Department has completed all promotional exams except the Driver/ Engineer position. The Civil Service Driver/Engineer promotional exam was administered on Wednesday, June 15. Two firefighters passed the exam. We are waiting for the appeal process to conclude on July 21. We will then receive the final Civil Service Driver/Engineer list. The Department currently has one vacant Driver/Engineer position.
- The National Weather Service in Fort Worth issued an Excessive Heat Advisory for North Central Texas in effect until 9:00 p.m. Thursday, July 14. Hot temperatures and high humidity will increase the risk for heat-related illnesses. Drink plenty of fluids and stay in an air-conditioned building if possible.
- As of July 14th, Dallas County remains under a outdoor burn ban due to high temperatures and drought conditions. Open flame cooking can be done outdoors during a burn ban, however the flames must be completely enclosed in the cooking device.
- The following photograph was taken in the Woodlands, TX, but it illustrates the need to be aware of parking on the streets, even in Duncanville. It is imperative to provide clearance for emergency vehicles to avoid delays and arrive safely when responding to calls for service.

Neighborhood Services

- Neighborhood Service Officers conducted 77 inspections (including reinspections) and have a total of 38 open cases.
- The Health Inspector conducted 9 health inspections.
- Permit Technicians, Neighborhood Service Officers, and the Building Inspector Coordinator attended the North Texas BPI conference in Irving, Texas. The four day event covered Architectural/Green Building, Code Enforcement, National Electrical Code, Engineering (Structural), Energy Code, Environmental Health Code, Fire Prevention, International Plumbing Code/International Mechanical Code, International Residential Code, Commercial IBC Field Inspections, Permit Technician, Plan Review, Basic Residential Construction & Inspection, Recertification for Plumbing Inspector's License, Texas Accessibility Standards, and Texas Accessibility Academy.
- The Health Inspector attended the North Texas Chapter Education Conference located at the Mesquite Arts Center.

Building Inspections

- A total of 1,783 single-family rental properties have been registered to date; two
 new properties were registered this week. Seventy-two inspections were
 completed since the previous update; twelve passed, thirty-four failed, and twentysix were canceled. The primary reasons for the failed inspections were the
 absence of GFCI protection as well as missing detectors for carbon monoxide and
 smoke. A total of 1,046 Certificates of Occupancy have been issued since the
 inception of the Single-Family Rental Registration Program.
- \$378,163.99 has been collected since the start of active lien collection in 2019, and \$6,144.72 has been collected since January 1, 2022. \$219.82 was collected this week.
- 92 permits were issued, and 149 inspections were conducted. 10 mobile vending units have been inspected to-date.






