### **Street Division**

### **Utilities Division**

- Water usage was 52.107 million gallons this reporting period, July 11-17, 2022, down from 52.418 million gallons the previous week. The daily peak water of 7.987 million gallons occurred on Monday, July 11. There were 0.0 inches of precipitation during this reporting period.
- Crews responded to five sewer calls and replaced one sewer line.
- Over ten right-of-way locates were completed for franchise utility companies.
- The Solid Waste Division received three calls with scheduling questions and ten complaints: five trash, three bulk, and two brush.
- Seven recycle bins were distributed to residents.
- The Trash Survey results were presented to the City Council on Tuesday, July 19.

### **CIP Construction**

• E. Danieldale Rd. Reconstruction & Utility Improvements Project (Main St. to US-67) — The City's contractor, Pavecon, removed the existing eastbound lane concrete. Their subcontractor, M-CO, set up and bored the 18-inch water main under the Dallas Water Utilities 54" water main close to S. Main St. The temporary sprinkler system on the north side of the roadway was also installed.

Forest Hills Ramps Reconstruction – The City of Duncanville and the Dallas County Planning & Development Department, via the federally funded HUD / Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program, are funding construction improvements to the reinforced concrete ramps and sidewalks at four intersections within the Forest Hills Subdivision. The City's contractor, Northstar Construction, LLC, continued setting the concrete formwork and pouring the new concrete ramps and new sidewalk at the intersection of Freeman Street and Center Street. Northstar also installed the new pedestrian pole foundations and is working to install the pedestrian push buttons within the coming week.

The Highway 67 Green Ribbon Construction Project – Green Ribbon Project construction commenced on October 11, 2021, with estimated completion now scheduled to occur in November 2022. In addition to site and irrigation improvements, the contractor is installing piers for the Wintergreen Road monument and pouring concrete for the footings. Landscape planting is expected to occur in August 2022.





• Fire Station #1 – Staff and BRW Architects completed the 100% construction drawings. CORE Construction, the Construction Manager at Risk, put the project out for bid. A "Subcontractor Outreach Event" was conducted on March 22, 2022, at the Senior Center from 4:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m., and a Virtual Pre-bid meeting was held on March 24, 2022. CORE opened bids on April 7, 2022. Council approved the Guaranteed Maximum Price agreement in June 2022. Notice of Intent to Award Contract was provided to Core Construction on July 20, 2022. Construction commencement should occur in Fall 2022, with completion anticipated in Fall 2023.

### Other Construction

 ONCOR Transmission Line Work at W. Camp Wisdom Rd. and N. Cedar Ridge – On July 29, 2021, Staff met with ONCOR to discuss the upcoming project to replace transmission lines along Camp Wisdom Rd. The ONCOR contractor removed the tower foundations and is working on sidewalk repairs.

the electrical line along Daniel St., Main St., Center St., Freeman St., and
Wheatland Rd. The upgrades will improve the electrical system's capacity in that
area. Work began earlier this month.



• TXDOT I-20 Construction Cockrell Hill Rd to Hampton Rd. TXDOT plans to construct new service roads and ramps from Cockrell Hill Rd in Duncanville to Hampton Rd in Dallas to include new bridges across US-67. Following City Council Resolution in August, TXDOT plans to relocate Cockrell Hill Rd Texas U-Turn from the northeast side of the bridge (not desired) to the southwest side of the bridge (desired). The project was awarded at the beginning of December 2021. The Pre-construction Meeting with TXDOT and the Contractor was held on February 1, 2022. Austin Bridge & Road, the contractor, started construction in April 2022, with an estimated completion date of November 2024.

### **FIRE DEPARTMENT**

- The Fire Department responded to 117 calls for service in the past seven days, which included:
  - o 84 EMS calls.
  - 8 motor vehicle accidents.
  - 1 brush fire in Duncanville.
  - 2 grass fires in Duncanville.
- The Department has one vacancy as of July 6. One of our Driver/Engineers has taken a position in another organization. We will have another vacancy in two weeks for a total of two vacancies.
- Of our four new employees, two of the firefighters now count as staffing, and the
  other two new employees will not be counted as staffing until they complete the
  required training after attending a firefighter academy. Two new employees are
  paramedics certified by the Texas Department of Health Services and will attend
  DeSoto's fire academy. The other two new employees are fire certified with the
  Texas Commission on Fire Protection and will attend A&P on Monday July 25,
  2022.
- The Fire Department has completed all promotional exams except the Driver/ Engineer position. The Civil Service Driver/Engineer promotional exam was administered on Wednesday, June 15, 2022. Two firefighters passed the exam. We await the appeal process to receive the final Civil Service Driver/Engineer list. The Department currently has two vacant Driver/Engineer positions.
- The National Weather Service in Fort Worth is forecasting temperatures of over 100 degrees until next Thursday, July 28. Hot temperatures and high humidity will increase the risk for heat-related illnesses. Drink plenty of fluids and stay in an airconditioned building if possible.
- As of July 21, Dallas County remains under an outdoor burn ban due to high temperatures and drought conditions. Open flame cooking can be done outdoors during a burn ban, however the flames must be completely enclosed in the cooking device.




