PUBLIC WORKS

Operational Updates:

Street Division

- Provided barricades for the Fire Truck Pull and a library event.
- Call-out crew responded to and removed tree blocking the road at 1700 Creekhaven.
- Repaired street at 314 West Vinyard and 300-400-500 W. Red Bird.
- Repaired sidewalk at 102 Walnut.
- Marked 56 right-of-way locates.
- Repaired post and cable at 110 W. Magnolia.
- Inspected fifty-six headwalls, cleaned twelve, and removed 6.25 cubic yards of brush and debris.
- Flushed pipe at 527 Roundtop to restore drainage.
- Removed brush from ROW at 1100 W. Wintergreen and 1000 West Ridge.

Utilities Division

- Water usage was 35.069 MG this reporting period, May 30-June 5, 2022, up from 34.798 MG the previous week. The daily peak water demand occurred on Monday, May 30, 2022, when 5.808 MG was used. There were 0.25 inches of precipitation during this reporting period.
- An estimated 153,001 gallons of water were lost, two hydrants were flushed, and five valves were exercised.
- There was one water service line repaired, one hydrant replaced, and one meter box replaced.
- Crews responded to three sewer calls, televised 457 feet of sewer line, and completed one sewer dig repair.
- Over fifteen right-of-way locates were completed.
- The Solid Waste Division received six calls with scheduling questions and three complaints regarding trash.
- Five recycle bins were distributed.

CIP Construction

- **E. Danieldale Road Reconstruction and Utility Improvements Project (Main Street to US-67)** – The City’s contractor, Pavecon, and their subcontractors are completing the punch list items for Phase 2 with the goal of switching traffic to the westbound lanes next week.

- Forest Hills Ramps Reconstruction** – The City of Duncanville and the Dallas County Planning & Development Department, via the federally funded HUD / Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program, are reconstructing and improving the reinforced concrete ramps and sidewalks at four intersections within the Forest Hills Subdivision. The City’s contractor, Northstar Construction, LLC, began clearing and grubbing vegetation and removing the concrete where ramps will be installed at the Freeman-Center intersection.



- **The Highway 67 Green Ribbon Construction Project** - Green Ribbon Project construction commenced on October 11, 2021, with estimated completion now scheduled to occur in June 2022. In addition to site and irrigation improvements, the contractor is installing piers for the Wintergreen Road monument and pouring concrete for the footings. Landscape planting is expected to occur in June 2022.



- **Fire Station #1** – Staff and BRW Architects completed the 100% Construction Drawings. CORE Construction, the Construction Manager at Risk, put the project out for bid. A “Subcontractor Outreach Event” was conducted on March 22, 2022, at the Senior Center from 4:00 pm-6:00 pm, and a Virtual Pre-bid meeting was held on March 24, 2022. CORE opened bids on April 7, 2022. Council approved the Guaranteed Maximum Price agreement in June 2022. Construction commencement should occur in Summer/Fall 2022, with completion anticipated in Summer 2023.



Other Construction

- **ONCOR Transmission Line Work @ W. Camp Wisdom Rd & N. Cedar Ridge.** On July 29, 2021, Staff met with ONCOR to discuss the upcoming project to replace transmission lines along Camp Wisdom Rd. The ONCOR contractor finished transferring the cables to the new towers along Camp Wisdom Rd and N. Cedar Ridge Drive and removed the existing towers. They will be removing the tower foundations in the coming weeks.



- **ONCOR Line Work in the vicinity of the Downtown District** – ONCOR is planning electrical line upgrades along Daniel St., Main St., Center St., Freeman St., and Wheatland Rd. The upgrades intend to improve the electrical system’s capacity in that area. Work is expected to start in Spring 2022.



- **TXDOT I-20 Construction Cockrell Hill Rd to Hampton Rd** – TXDOT plans to construct new service roads and ramps from Cockrell Hill Rd in Duncanville to Hampton Rd in Dallas to include new bridges across US-67. Following City Council Resolution in August, TXDOT plans to relocate Cockrell Hill Rd Texas U-Turn from the northeast side of the bridge (not desired) to the southwest side of the bridge (desired). The project was awarded at the beginning of December 2021. The Pre-construction Meeting with TXDOT and the Contractor was held on February 1, 2022. Austin Bridge & Road, the contractor, started construction in April 2022, with an estimated completion date of November 2024.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

- The Fire Department responded to 127 calls for service in the past seven days, which included:
 - 89 EMS calls.
 - 11 motor vehicle accidents.
 - 1 brush fire in Duncanville.
 - 1 outdoor illuminated sign fire in Duncanville.
- The Department has filled all vacancies. The four new employees will not be counted as staffing until they complete the required training. Two new employees are paramedics certified with the Texas Department of Health Services and will be attending DeSoto's fire academy. The other two new employees are fire certified with the Texas Commission on Fire Protection and will be attending paramedic school.

- The Fire Department has completed all promotional exams except the Driver/Engineer position. The next Civil Service Driver/Engineer promotional exam is scheduled for Wednesday, June 15, 2022.
- Chief Rohde attended the Texas Department of Emergency Management conference in San Antonio from May 31-June 3, 2022. Elected officials, first responders, emergency managers, and decision-makers from all across Texas attended the conference. The conference allows jurisdictions to see and learn about innovative products and services from numerous organizations.
- The Department paramedics attended continuing education this week. The CE was a review of excited delirium cases and treatment.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

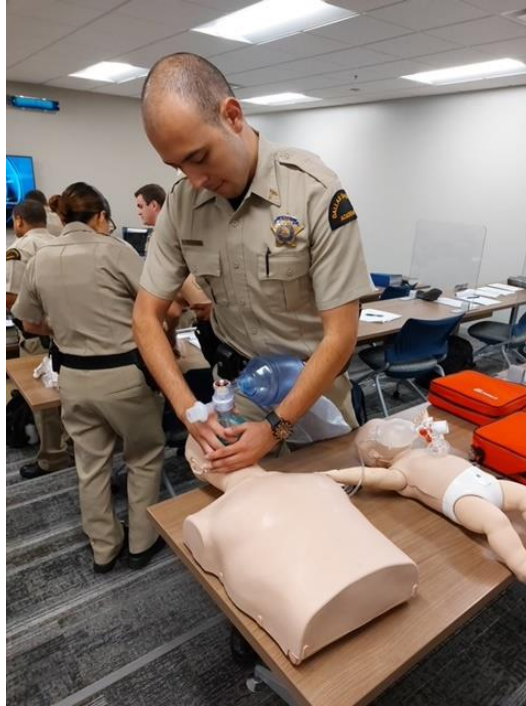
- Our narcotics and SWAT units executed a narcotics evidentiary search warrant at 5512 S. Cockrell Hill Road (Dallas) that yielded approximately 250 kilograms of powdered and liquid methamphetamine, 30 pounds of marijuana, 3 firearms, and one stolen vehicle. The seized narcotics have an estimated street value of \$10 million and is the largest seizure in Duncanville Police Department's history.



PERSONNEL

- Officer Fares Acosta is currently in his CID phase of field training and is doing well
- Officer Ralston Marshall is currently in his third phase of field training. His expected completion of field training is June 29th.
- One patrol candidate has passed all preliminary tests and she is scheduled to begin employment with the department on Tuesday, June 21, 2022
- We have eight openings - seven after June 21.
- Training and Personnel Division are currently working backgrounds on the remaining police applicants
- Training and Personnel Division has submitted a plan to administration for an out-of-state recruiting trip to help promote the police department for our future testing dates
 - Plan was presented to administration and approved
- Recruits Saul Vara and Brandon Dunn are doing very well while attending the Dallas County Sheriff's Office Police Academy. They are both scheduled to graduate at the end of July. Both recruits learned juvenile procedure and received CPR certification this week.





COMMUNITY CORNER

The 13th Annual Fire Truck Pull was held this Saturday, June 4, at Armstrong Park. About 400 people participated. This year's winner was Dallas SWAT, with our department coming in a close third behind Duncanville Fire. It was an enjoyable event for all and helped raise money for Special Olympics Texas.





- Chief LiVigni, Community Officer Arias and Councilmember Koontz held a Neighborhood Crime Watch meeting in the Fairmeadows district. Approximately twenty-five citizens attended the meeting.

- Wheatland Plaza update: submitted an application for a 2022 TML Municipal Excellence Award for the Wheatland Plaza project under the City Spirit category. The award recognizes Texas cities that meet the challenges of municipal government, such as, innovative problem-solving, excellence in management, increasing citizen participation, and reaching toward higher service levels. The City Spirit category highlights any citywide effort to address a city need. This may include projects focused on neighborhood clean-up, beautification, economic development, historic preservation, or other projects supported by broad-based city efforts.
- ARPA Emergency Business Assistance: evaluating applications for verification of validity and accuracy. Additional funding was approved.
- New Project Prospect: Project Hill. Mixed-use redevelopment opportunity. Met with the property owner to discuss their future plans for the property.
- Participated in the new council orientation tour for Councilmember Cherry.
- Prepared FY23 budget documentations for presentation to the DCEDC board.
- Monitoring, and assisting when able, the permit process for Project Roast.

Neighborhood Services

- Neighborhood Service Officers conducted 175 inspections and re-inspections this week. There are currently a total of 71 open cases.
- The Health Inspector conducted 26 health inspections.
- Two new employees have joined the Neighborhood Services team: Jose “Ernesto” Lanas & Marquii Thomas.

Building Inspections

- A total of 1,790 single-family rental properties have been registered to date; three new properties were registered since the last update. Fifty-three inspections were completed since the previous update: eighteen passed, twenty-nine failed, and six were canceled. The primary reasons for the failed inspections were absence of GFCI protection, and missing carbon monoxide and smoke detectors. A total of 982 Certificates of Occupancy have been issued since the inception of the Single-Family Rental Registration Program.
- Since the start of active lien collection in 2019, \$375,846.54 has been collected. A total of \$4,676.67 has been collected since January 1, 2022.
- This week 79 permits were issued, and 58 inspections were done. To date we have inspected four mobile vending units.

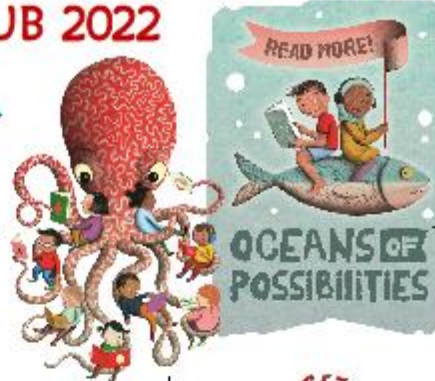

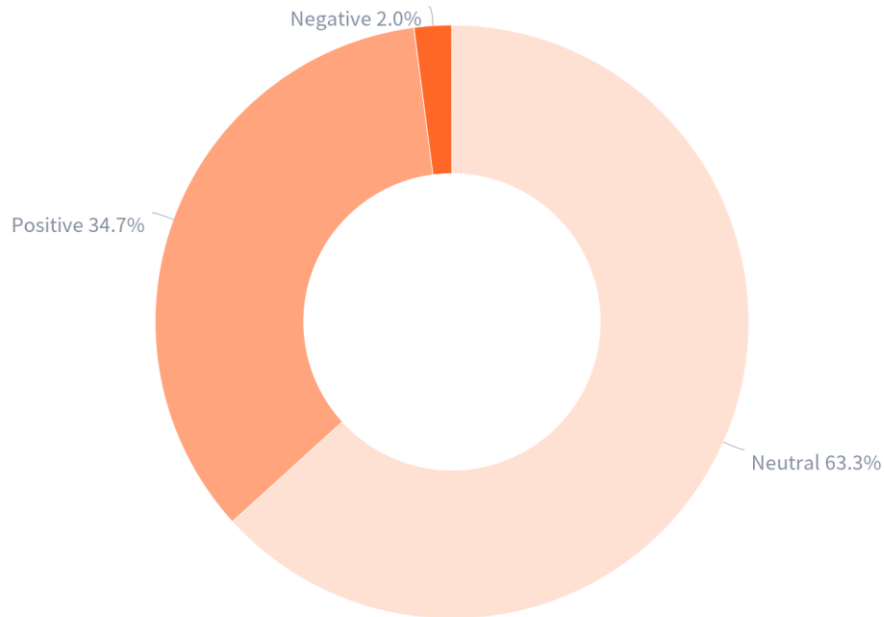

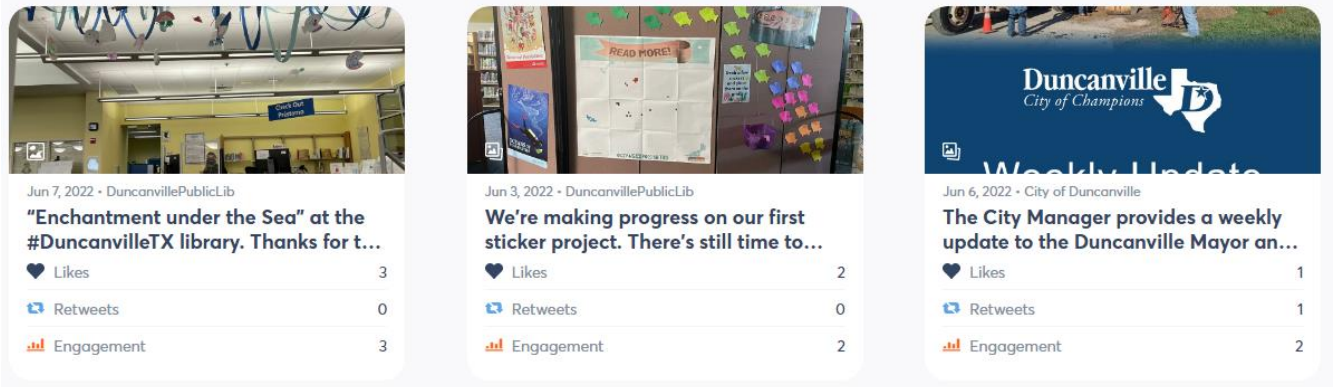
