PUBLIC WORKS

Operational Updates:

Street Division

- Marked three right-of-way locates.
- Removed .25 cubic yards of debris from S. Main St.
- Inspected one hundred and sixteen inlets, cleaned twenty, and removed four cubic yards of trash and debris.
- Inspected forty headwalls, cleaned five, and removed one cubic yard of debris.
- Repaired the street on Thrush and the sidewalk on Woodacre Circle.
- Removed ten cubic yards of brush in the right-of-way on Hill City.
- Responded to a request to remove a tree on Gaynor and another request to remove construction fencing from the street on W. Camp Wisdom.
- Set barricades for Duncan-Switch, a high school football game, and a Battle of the Bands event at Dunanville High School.

Utilities Division

- Water usage was 37.401 million gallons this reporting period, October 17 October 23, 2022, down from 39.669 million gallons the previous week. The daily peak water demand of 5.528 million gallons occurred on Monday, October 17. There were 0.0 inches of precipitation during this reporting period.
- Twenty-two hydrants were flushed, eleven valves were exercised, and an estimated 370,659 gallons of water were lost, including one main break.
- Three service lines were installed.
- Crews responded to two sewer calls.
- Crews installed one water meter, cleaned 7,890 feet of sewer, and 234 feet of the sewer line was televised.
- The Solid Waste Division received one scheduling question and six complaints about brush. Republic utilized a third-party to assist with brush and bulk collection delays. Five recycle bins were distributed.

CIP Construction

• E. Danieldale Rd. Reconstruction and Utility Improvements Project (Main St. to US-67) – M-CO, Pavecon's subcontractor, installed the 16-inch water main up to Bob Lee Blvd. and the wastewater laterals for 7-Eleven and Wells Fargo.

• **FY22 Pipebursting** – Vortex is installing sanitary sewer mains by pipe bursting in the Forest Hills subdivision.



• The Highway 67 Green Ribbon Construction Project – Green Ribbon Project construction commenced on October 11, 2021, with estimated completion now scheduled to occur in December 2022. The landscape monument at Cockrell Hill Rd. and Interstate Highway 20 is being constructed.




 Fire Station #1 – Council approved the Guaranteed Maximum Price agreement in June 2022.The Construction Kickoff meeting was held on August 10, 2022 and monthly progress meetings began on September 7, 2022. Construction has commenced, and a ribbon cutting that was scheduled for October 25 is being rescheduled. The anticipated completion date is Fall 2023.



Other Construction

- ONCOR Transmission Line Work at W. Camp Wisdom Rd. and N. Cedar Ridge – Much of the work to replace transmission lines along Camp Wisdom Rd. has been completed by Oncor's contractor. The contractor removed the tower foundations and is working on sidewalk repairs.
- ONCOR Line Work in the vicinity of the Downtown District ONCOR is upgrading the electrical line along Daniel St., Main St., Center St., Freeman St., and Wheatland Rd. The upgrades will improve the electrical system's capacity in that area. Work has commenced.
- TXDOT I-20 Construction Cockrell Hill Rd to Hampton Rd TXDOT plans to construct new service roads and ramps from Cockrell Hill Rd. in Duncanville to Hampton Rd. in Dallas to include new bridges across US-67. Following City Council Resolution in August, TXDOT will construct the US-67 Cockrell Hill Rd. Texas U-Turn on the southwest side of the bridge. The project was awarded at the beginning of December 2021. The Pre-construction Meeting with TXDOT and the contractor was held on February 1, 2022. Austin Bridge & Road, the contractor, started construction in April 2022, with an estimated completion date of January 2025. A meeting with the Mayor, staff, and TXDOT took place on Monday, August 22, to discuss construction improvements that could impair visibility at the City-owned property located at 730 E. Interstate Highway 20. TXDOT provided plans and additional renderings to the City.



FIRE DEPARTMENT

- The Fire Department responded to 152 calls for service in the past seven days, which included:
 - 86 EMS calls for service.
 - o 23 Motor Vehicle Accidents.
 - o 2 residential structure fires in Duncanville.
 - 2 grass fires in Duncanville.
- The Fire Prevention Division has completed six fire inspections this week.
- Fire Marshal Steve Wakeland is attending the State Fire Marshal Conference in San Marcos.
- Emergency Management Operations Coordinator, Lauren Sanchez, lead a Regional Damage Assessment Training for officials from Duncanville, Desoto, Cedar Hill and Lancaster. These assessments will rapidly help identify damage to structures and property if a destructive event occurs in the region. She also held an emergency preparedness class with the Duncanville Lions Club.

- Attended the Texas Economic Development Council annual meeting in San Antonio and had the opportunity to network with other economic development professionals to discuss best practices and learn about innovation, technology, retail, business retention and expansion, workforce development, and emerging markets.
- The DCEDC regular meeting was held on October 24 and two signage grants were approved. The recommendations will go before City Council for approval on November 15. The grant applicants are:

Neighborhood Services

- Neighborhood Service Officers conducted 131 inspections, including reinspections, and have a total of fifty-six open cases.
- Last week, staff identified seventy-four bulk brush piles located in front of citizen homes due to delays in bulk pick-up throughout the City. Three bulk trucks were conducting removals of standing piles to resolve issue.

Building and Inspections

- A total of 1,837 single-family rental properties have been registered to date; one new property was registered this week. Thirty-eight inspections were completed since the previous update; twenty-three passed, nine failed, and six were cancelled. The primary reasons for the failed inspections were absence of GFCI protection, as well as missing carbon monoxide and smoke detectors. A total of 1,263 Certificates of Occupancy have been issued since the inception of the Single-Family Rental Registration Program.
- This week 107 permits were issued and 192 inspections were conducted.

 - Clients resubmitted plat on October 21 and that plat is being reviewed by staff.

- Comprehensive Plan Five-Year Update:
 - Planning is at the beginning stages of updating the Comprehensive Plan.
 - Planning and Zoning Commission is focusing on the Downtown District area, discussing the incorporation of new areas, and considering ways to incorporate green energy.
 - Staff recommendations for updates to the Zoning Ordinance will eventually become a part of this process.

• Short-Term Rental Registration Program:

- Six final notices and four initial notices were mailed on August 2.
- Five properties are going through the Specific Use Permit process.
- One property is no longer operating as a short-term rental and three properties have registered as long-term rentals.
- Four properties have been granted a Specific Use Permit by the Council.

- Per the request of the City Manager's Office, staff cleaned debri behind CVS and Family Dollar locations.
- Six trees were removed as a result of high winds on October 25.
- Staff has prepared installation of new fitness equipment at Red Bird Park.
- The planting of Fall annuals at city facilities and right-of-way locations continues. Brightview is assisting in the planting and beautification efforts in front of City Hall.
- BrightView Landscape Services completed 31 of its 43 required mowing cycles for the week of October 17 – October 21, 2022. Staff continues to meet weekly to discuss quality and scheduling performance issues.


Boo Bash 2022 at Duncanville Fieldhouse - Friday, October 28th | 6:30 pm






