PUBLIC WORKS

Operational Updates:

Utilities Division

- Water usage was 29.267 million gallons this reporting period, November 14 through November 20, down from 30.0428 million gallons the previous week. The daily peak water demand of 4.348 million gallons occurred On Tuesday, November 15. There were 0.39 inches of precipitation during this reporting period.
- Twelve hydrants were flushed.
- An estimated 364,250 gallons of water loss occurred, including a water main break and leaks.
- Ten valves were exercised
- Three water main breaks and one service line were repaired.
- Crews responded to four sewer calls as well as televised twenty feet of sewer lines and ninety-five feet of storm sewer lines.
- The Solid Waste Division received one call regarding scheduling and three complaints: one trash and two brush. Five recycle bins were distributed.

CIP Construction:

- **E. Danieldale Rd. Reconstruction and Utility Improvements Project (Main St. to US-67)** – M-CO, Pavecon's subcontractor, continued the 16-inch water main installation.

- **FY22 Pipe bursting** – Vortex is installing sanitary sewer mains by pipe bursting along E. Center St. in the Forest Hills subdivision.



- **The Highway 67 Green Ribbon Construction Project** – Green Ribbon Project construction commenced on October 11, 2021, with estimated completion now scheduled to occur in December 2022. The landscape monument at Cockrell Hill Rd. and Interstate Highway 20 is being constructed.



- **Fire Station 271** – Council approved the Guaranteed Maximum Price agreement with CORE Construction in June 2022. The Construction Kickoff meeting was held on August 10, 2022 and monthly progress meetings began on September 7. Construction has commenced. The Fire Station 271 Groundbreaking Ceremony, previously scheduled for October 25, has been rescheduled to December 1 at 10:00 a.m. Completion of the fire station is slated for Fall 2023.



Other Construction

- ONCOR Transmission Line Work at W. Camp Wisdom Rd. and N. Cedar Ridge** – Much of the work to replace transmission lines along Camp Wisdom Rd. has been completed by Oncor's contractor. The contractor removed the tower foundations and is working on sidewalk repairs.
- ONCOR Line Work in the vicinity of the Downtown District** – ONCOR is upgrading the electrical line along Daniel St., Main St., Center St., Freeman St., and Wheatland Rd. The upgrades will improve the electrical system's capacity in that area. Work has commenced.



- TXDOT I-20 Construction Cockrell Hill Rd. to Hampton Rd.** – TXDOT plans to construct new service roads and ramps from Cockrell Hill Rd. in Duncanville to Hampton Rd. in Dallas to include new bridges across US-67. Following City Council Resolution in August, TXDOT will construct the US-67 Cockrell Hill Rd. Texas U-Turn on the southwest side of the bridge. The project was awarded at the beginning of December 2021. The Pre-construction Meeting with TXDOT and the contractor was held on February 1, 2022. Austin Bridge & Road, the contractor, started construction in April 2022, with an estimated completion date of January 2025. Austin Bridge is constructing the Texas U-Turn at Cockrell Hill and Highway 67.



FISCAL SERVICES

- **Municipal Court:**

 - The Utility Customer Service Field crew replaced two residential meters and one meter curb stop.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

- The Fire Department responded to 137 calls for service in the past seven days, which included:
 - 104 EMS calls.
 - 10 motor vehicle accidents.
 - 2 structure fires.
- The Fire Prevention Division completed three system checks, four Certificate of Occupancy inspections, and twelve business inspections.
- The Department currently has two vacancies. There is a Civil Service exam scheduled for December 17 which consists of a written exam and physical agility test.
- Firefighters Tony Jones and Taylor Arrington are attending Paramedic school.
- Fire Chief Sam Rohde and EMS Chief Kevin Bragg are attending the Texas EMS Conference in Austin, TX where they are attending classes for Continued Education credit and receiving updates on State Emergency Medical Services.
- Regional Emergency Management Operations Coordinator Lauren Sanchez is working with Duncanville ISD to update their child reunification plans and maps. Sanchez is hosting a Child Program Safety training for churches and daycares in the four cities on December 8th where they will learn emergency preparedness and child reunification protocol.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

- Cadet Brandon Dunn is in field training and expected to graduate in mid-December.
- Cadet Jessica Determan is in the basic peace officer academy and will graduate on December 9.
- Cadet Paul Becerra is in the basic peace officer academy and will graduate in April 2023.
- Training and Personnel are actively conducting background investigations on applicants.
- We have eight openings for sworn personnel.
- Chief LiVigni attended mandatory training at the Law Enforcement Management Institute of Texas with fifty-two other Chiefs from around Texas.



COMMUNITY CORNER

- The police department hosted a prayer breakfast for clergy from local churches.



- Members of the police department delivered boxed Thanksgiving meals to several families within the community.

Economic Development

- ARPA Small Business Assistance Round One: Finished processing all businesses that provided the required documentation. Reached out to businesses that have yet to provide sufficient supplemental documentation.
- ARPA Small Business Assistance Round Two: Staff is processing Round Two applicants for presentation to Council at the December 20 meeting.
- Assisted a local business seeking to significantly expand its business operations and discussed EDC grant incentives.
- Project Skyline: Continuing to work on internal administrative items to get the target area surveyed for future development.

Building and Inspections

- A total of 1,849 single-family rental properties have been registered to date; two new properties were registered this week. Twenty-six inspections were completed since the previous update; sixteen passed, nine failed, and one was canceled. The primary reasons for the failed inspections were absence of GFCI protection, as well as missing carbon monoxide and smoke detectors. A total of 1,295 Certificates of Occupancy have been issued since the inception of the Single-Family Rental Registration Program.
- Since the start of active lien collection in 2019, \$384,101.30 has been collected. A total of \$12,082.03 has been collected since January 1, 2022, including \$350.00 this week.
- This week 72 permits were issued, and 166 inspections were conducted.

Neighborhood Services

- Neighborhood Service Officers conducted 86 inspections, including re-inspections, and have a total of 34 open cases.
- Offers have been made to the candidates for Administrative Assistant and Neighborhood Services Officer.
- Interviews have begun for the Health Inspector position.
- Staff was recognized along with the many volunteers and City Council members at the Property Improvement Program Days Appreciation Dinner last Thursday, November 17, 2022. The event allowed everyone that has participated in the event over the years to come together and share their appreciation for one another as we strive to do our part in keeping the City of Duncanville the beautiful jewel that it is.

 - Planning is at the beginning stages of updating the Comprehensive Plan.
 - Planning and Zoning Commission is focusing on the Downtown District area, discussing the incorporation of new areas, and considering ways to incorporate green energy.
 - Staff recommendations for updates to the Zoning Ordinance will eventually become a part of this process.
 - **Short-Term Rental Registration Program:**
 - Six final notices and four initial notices were mailed on August 2.
 - Four properties are going through the Specific Use Permit process.
 - One property is no longer operating as a short-term rental and four properties have registered as long-term rentals.
 - Four property owners have not responded.
 - Four properties were granted a Specific Use Permit by the Council.

PARKS AND RECREATION

Parks:

- BrightView Landscape Services completed all the required mowing cycles for the week of November 14 through December 2, 2022. Staff continues to meet weekly to discuss quality and scheduling performance issues.
- Staff inspected and monitored contractor performance and addressed Highway 67 Green Ribbon project specification issues. Staff inspected the final four thousand landscape plants on the project and attended the weekly project meeting.
- The fitness equipment installation at Red Bird Park is complete. Installation of fitness equipment at Armstrong Park has begun.
- Staff continues to install Christmas lights and decorations at City Hall, Armstrong Park, Memorial Park, and Service Center.
- Staff installed three Christmas banners and ornaments on Main St. and Wheatland Rd.
- Staff assisted with the fish restocking at Lakeside Park.

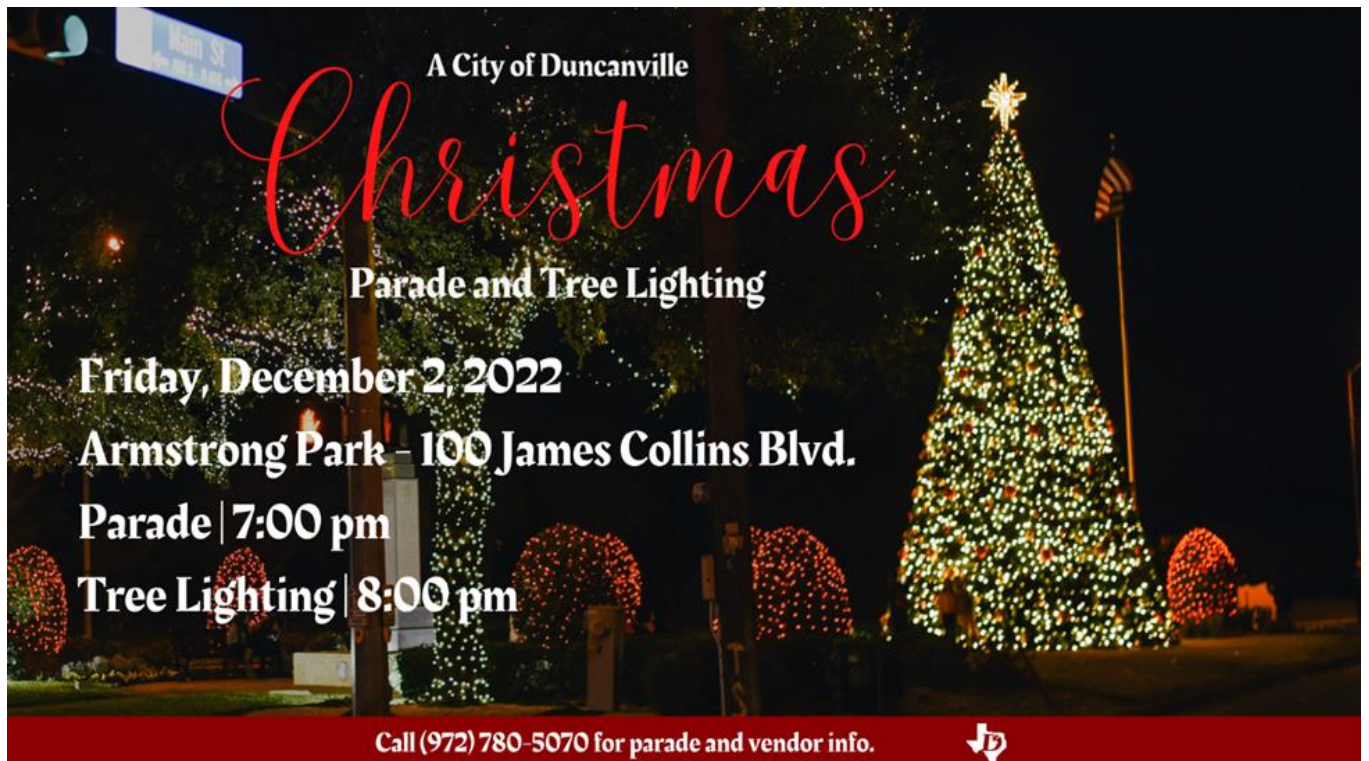

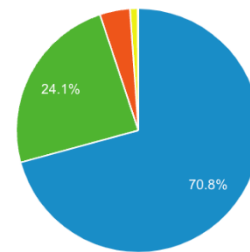

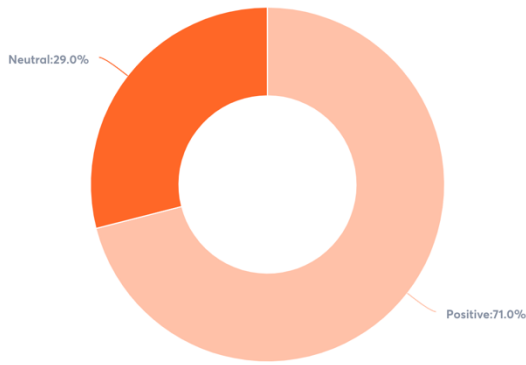
