Subject: Weekly Update

PUBLIC WORKS

Operational Updates:

Street Division

- Marked fifteen rights-of-way in various locations.
- Repaired five potholes on Linkcrest and Linkcrest Circle, and one pothole on East Camp Wisdom Road.
- Inspected fourteen headwalls, cleaned three headwalls, and removed eighteen cubic yards of trash and debris.
- Inspected eighty-six inlets, cleaned twenty-six inlets, and removed four cubic yards of trash and debris.
- Responded to callout requests to remove fallen trees from the right-of-way at Belmont and Wintergreen.
- Reshaped eighty-one linear feet of a bar ditch to improve drainage at Casa Grande Place.
- Repaired the sidewalk on Willowbrook Drive.

Sanitation Division

• The Solid Waste Division received four trash complaints and distributed three recycling bins.

Utilities Division

- Water usage was 31.32 million gallons during this reporting period, December 26, 2022-January 1, 2023, down from 32.759 million gallons the previous week. The daily peak water demand of 4.917 million gallons occurred on Monday, December 26. There were 0.00 inches of precipitation during this reporting period.
- One hydrant was flushed, and seven valves were exercised.
- An estimated 188,617 gallons of water loss occurred.
- Crews responded to six sewer backup calls.

CIP Construction:

- **FY22 Pipe bursting** Vortex resumed pipe bursting activities along E. Center Street in the Forest Hills subdivision.
- E. Danieldale Rd. Reconstruction and Utility Improvements Project (Main St. to US-67) – M-CO, Pavecon's subcontractor, completed installation of a new Dallas Water Utilities water line. An 18-inch water line is currently being installed.

 Fire Station 271 – Council approved the Guaranteed Maximum Price agreement with CORE Construction in June 2022. The Construction Kickoff meeting was held on August 10, 2022, and monthly progress meetings began on September 7, 2022. Construction has commenced. The contractor is installing grade beams. The Fire Station 271 Groundbreaking Ceremony will be rescheduled, and completion of the station is slated for Fall 2023.



• The Highway 67 Green Ribbon Construction Project – Green Ribbon Project construction is substantially complete. Full completion, including seasonal planting, is scheduled for Spring 2023. The landscape monuments at Cockrell Hill Rd. and Highway 67 are complete. Both monuments are permanently illuminated.



Other Construction

 TXDOT I-20 Construction Cockrell Hill Rd. to Hampton Rd. – TXDOT plans to construct new service roads and ramps from Cockrell Hill Rd. in Duncanville to Hampton Rd. in Dallas to include new bridges across US-67. Following City Council Resolution in August, TXDOT will construct the US-67 Cockrell Hill Rd. Texas U-Turn on the southwest side of the bridge. The project was awarded at the beginning of December 2021. The Pre-construction Meeting with TXDOT and the contractor was held on February 1, 2022. Austin Bridge & Road, the contractor, started construction in April 2022, with an estimated completion date of January 2025. Austin Bridge is constructing the Texas U-Turn at Cockrell Hill and Highway 67.



 ONCOR Line Work in the vicinity of the Downtown District – ONCOR is upgrading the electrical line along Daniel St., Main St., Center St., Freeman St., and Wheatland Rd. The upgrades will improve the electrical system's capacity in that area. Work has commenced.




FISCAL SERVICES

- Docket 88 cases
- Cases processed 545
- 158 water disconnections for cycle two and cycle three customers with a past due balance were processed.
- The utility customer service field crew replaced two customer meter curb stops.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

- The Fire Department responded to 175 calls for service in the past seven days, which included:
 - o 87 EMS calls.
 - 4 motor vehicle accidents.
 - 1 motor structure fire.
 - 1 cooking fire.
 - o 2 grass fires.
- The Fire Prevention Division completed one system check and ten inspections.
- The Department has three vacancies. A Civil Service exam was given on December 17. Sixteen applicants attended the examination, with twelve continuing the process. Applicant's personal history statements are due Friday, January 6 by 4:00 p.m.
- Firefighters Tony Jones and Taylor Arrington are attending Paramedic school and performing their ambulance ride-outs.
- Fire Marshal Steve Wakeland's retiring. His last day with the City is Friday, December 30, 2022. Congratulations to Steve and his dedication to the community with 25 years of service.

- The DCEDC and Options Real Estate hosted a Coffee & Cocoa to discuss the ongoing development at Wheatland Plaza.
- Jeremiah Brewer has been officially promoted to the position of Executive Assistant for Development Services. Mr. Brewer started his employment with the City in May 2022 as the Economic Development Intern, and has been the Interim Executive Assistant since October 2022. He recently graduated with a Masters of Public Affairs from the University of Texas at Dallas.

Building and Inspections

- 1,858 single-family rental properties have been registered to date; two new properties were registered since the last update. Thirteen inspections were completed since the previous update: five passed and eight failed. The primary reasons for the failed inspections were absence of GFCI protection, as well as missing carbon monoxide and smoke detectors. 1,326 Certificates of Occupancy have been issued since the inception of the Single-Family Rental Registration Program.
- Since the start of active lien collection in 2019, \$385,564.58 has been collected. A total of \$13,545.31 has been collected since January 1, 2022.
- This week 37 permits were issued, and 109 inspections were conducted.
- To date we have inspected 11 mobile vending units.

Neighborhood Services

• Neighborhood Service Officers conducted 76 inspections, including re-inspections, and have thirty-six open cases.

Planning and Zoning

- New and Potential Projects:
 - Proposed expansion of Village Tech School including the addition of a track and field:
 - The planning team arranged a pre-development meeting to discuss the Village Tech expansion on December 1, 2022. In December 2018 Council passed Ordinance No. 2356 to approve the original site plan for expansion.
 - Staff is updating the site plan, discussing a fire lane, planning development phases, and potentially amending the Specific Use Permit program, as the current City Zoning Ordinance does not define what a major or minor amendment is.
 - Discussions continue with Public Works and Police Departments about traffic control during pickup and drop off.
 - Developers are finalizing square footage of the proposed addition and existing portable buildings on the site, and will provide Public Works information regarding drainage.
 - Additional conversations were had with the Fire and Building Departments to ensure fire protection mechanisms, such as fire sprinklers and alarms, are included in the development plans and to determine if the proposed location of the Fire Department Connection is sufficient.
 - Planning will submit lighting requirements and the residential proximity slope section of the City Zoning Ordinance.
 - New Development at 300 West Highway 67:
 - Replat approved at the Planning and Zoning meeting on July 25, 2022. Client submitted recorded plat on December 6, 2022.
 - Plans have been approved by all departments. Once the client pays for the permit construction can begin.
 - A pre-construction meeting was held on January 3, 2023.
 - New Development at 518 East Highway 67:
 - A preliminary meeting was held on July 12.
 - Pre-development meetings were held on August 22 and November 28.
 - Clients are working on engineering and will be submitting permits soon.

- New Development at 700 West Camp Wisdom Road:
 - Planned Development request was approved by City Council on October 18, 2022.
 - The building permit application was submitted. The architectural and engineering plans are being reviewed by staff.
- New Development at 704 North Main Street:
 - A site plan was submitted on August 30, 2022.
 - A building permit application was submitted on November 18, 2022, and is under staff review.
- Expansion at 803, 807, 809, and 811 South Cockrell Hill Road:
 - Replat was approved at the Planning and Zoning meeting on November 28, 2022.
 - The purpose of the replat and zoning is to construct an accessory structure to allow for hearse car parking.
- Items tracking for January 9 Planning and Zoning meeting:
 - Text Amendment to allow carports by right in certain residential zoning districts.
 - February 7 City Council meeting.
- Items tracking for February 13 Planning and Zoning meeting:
 - Specific Use Permit request for an art studio at 214 S. Main St.
 - March 7 City Council meeting.

• Ongoing:

- Comprehensive Plan Five-Year Update:
 - Planning and Zoning Commission is focusing on Opportunity Area 1 and Opportunity Area 8.
 - Staff recommendations for updates to the Zoning Ordinance will eventually become a part of this process.
- Short-Term Rental Registration Program:
 - Six final notices and four initial notices were mailed on August 2.
 - Four properties are going through the Specific Use Permit process.
 - One property is no longer operating as a short-term rental, and four properties have registered as long-term rentals.
 - Four property owners have not responded.
 - Four properties were granted a Specific Use Permit by the Council.
