Subject: Weekly Update

PUBLIC WORKS

Utilities Division

- Water usage was 29.251 million gallons during this reporting period, January 16-22, down from 29.292 million gallons the previous week. The daily peak water demand of 4.555 million gallons occurred on Monday, January 16. There were 0.00 inches of precipitation during this reporting period.
- Nine hydrants were flushed. Two service lines and six hydrants were repaired.
- An estimated 67,852 gallons of water loss occurred this week.
- Crews responded to five sewer backup calls, televised 143 feet of sewer line, and cleaned 20,850 feet of sewer line in the Winona Gardens, The Greene, and Green Hills areas.

Sanitation Division

• The Solid Waste Division received three complaints and four scheduling questions. Eleven recycling bins were distributed. Republic started recycling glass at the beginning of this month.

Street Division

- Marked ten right-of-way locates.
- Repaired sections of sidewalk on Willowbrook.
- Repaired utility cuts on N. Main, Meadowglen, Nature, and Linkmeadow.
- Made repairs to the street on Calder.
- Removed debris from N. Main St.

CIP Construction:

• E. Danieldale Rd. Reconstruction and Utility Improvements Project (Main St. to US-67) – M-CO, Pavecon's subcontractor, completed the installation of a new Dallas Water Utilities line and is awaiting testing per DWU's schedule. The newly installed 18-inch water line is 99% complete, the valve vaults and air release valves have been installed, and the pressure test has been completed. They are in the process of Bac-T sampling.

- FY22 Pipe bursting Vortex continues pipe bursting activities and is working on Fairmeadows Circle.
- The Highway 67 Green Ribbon Construction Project Green Ribbon Project construction is substantially complete. Full completion, including seasonal planting, is scheduled for Spring 2023. The landscape monuments at Cockrell Hill Rd. and Highway 67 are complete. Both monuments are permanently illuminated.



 Fire Station 271 – Council approved the Guaranteed Maximum Price agreement with CORE Construction in June 2022. The Construction Kickoff meeting was held on August 10, 2022, and monthly progress meetings began on September 7, 2022. Construction has commenced. The contractor is installing grade beams. The Fire Station 271 Groundbreaking Ceremony will be rescheduled, and completion of the station is slated for Fall 2023.



Other Construction

- TXDOT I-20 Construction Cockrell Hill Rd. to Hampton Rd. TXDOT plans to construct new service roads and ramps from Cockrell Hill Rd. in Duncanville to Hampton Rd. in Dallas to include new bridges across US-67. Following City Council Resolution in August, TXDOT will construct the US-67 Cockrell Hill Rd. Texas U-Turn on the southwest side of the bridge. The project was awarded at the beginning of December 2021. The Pre-construction Meeting with TXDOT and the contractor was held on February 1, 2022. Austin Bridge & Road, the contractor, started construction in April 2022, with an estimated completion date of January 2025. The Texas U-Turn at Cockrell Hill and Highway 67 is under construction.
- ONCOR Line Work in the vicinity of the Downtown District ONCOR is upgrading the electrical line along Daniel St., Main St., Center St., Freeman St., and Wheatland Rd. The upgrades will improve the electrical system's capacity in that area. Work has commenced.



POLICE DEPARTMENT

PERSONNEL

- A Civil Service Exam was held on Saturday, January 21. The pass rate on the written exam was 100%, creating an active list of fifteen potential applicants.
- Officer Jessica Determan is in field training and doing well.
- We have ten openings for sworn personnel.
- Training and Personnel are conducting background checks on potential applicants.

COMMUNITY CORNER

- The Duncanville Police Department began its Citizen On Patrol training for recent graduates of the Citizen's Police Academy.
- Chief LiVigni, Assistant Chief Stogner, Assistant Chief Freis, and Crime Prevention Officer Michelle Arias attended the Chamber of Commerce's "Celebrate Duncanville" event on January 19.
- Crime Prevention Officer Michelle Arias spoke to the Alcoholics Anonymous group
 of Duncanville at their annual banquet, which was held at First Methodist Church.
 Officer Arias spoke about the dangers and consequences of drinking and driving.
 Approximately 120 people attended this meeting.



FIRE DEPARTMENT

- The Fire Department responded to 129 calls for service in the past seven days, which included:
 - o 98 EMS calls.
 - 1 motor vehicle accidents
 - 1 structure fire
 - 8 requests for assistance.
- The Fire Prevention Division completed eleven inspections, including two Certificate of Occupancy inspections and one day care inspection, attended four pre-development meetings, conducted three plan reviews, and investigated one fire.
- The Department has three vacancies. A Civil Service exam was given on December 17. Sixteen applicants attended the examination, with twelve continuing the process. Applicants' personal history statements have been reviewed, and five interviews were held on Wednesday, January 25. From those interviews, one candidate will proceed in the process while the other four candidates have been discontinued from the process.
- The Department continues to advance with professional development:
 - Executvie Assistant Lacey Freeman attended the Texas Fire Chiefs Association Fire Administrative Professional Workshop January 23-25. The conference provides position-specific training and development opportunities, enabling personnel to provide a high level of support.
 - Assistant Chief Greg Chase attended the Texas Fire Chiefs Association's Second in Command Workshop from January 23-25. The workshop tackles common challenges encountered in the position and discusses innovations and strategies being utilized in departments throughout Texas.
- Firefighters Tony Jones and Taylor Arrington have completed paramedic school and are assigned to shift duty.

DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

- Continued processing ARPA small business payments.
- Dominik Rico, Economic Development Intern, started work on January 23. He is currently majoring in Economics at the University of Texas at Arlington.

Building and Inspections

- 1,861 single-family rental properties have been registered to date; one new property was registered this week. Twenty-six inspections were completed since the previous update: eleven passed, fourteen failed, and one was canceled. The primary reasons for the failed inspections were absence of GFCI protection, as well as missing carbon monoxide and smoke detectors. 1,340 Certificates of Occupancy have been issued since the inception of the Single-Family Rental Registration Program.
- Since the start of active lien collection in 2019, \$385,823.71 has been collected, including \$13,545.31 since January 1, 2022. \$259.13 was collected this week.
- This week 67 permits were issued, and 132 inspections were conducted.
- To date we have inspected 11 mobile vending units.

Neighborhood Services

 Neighborhood Service Officers conducted 93 inspections, including re-inspections, and have 40 open cases.

 Our Health Inspector conducted nine routine inspections, including re-inspections, three routine pool inspections, and two CO inspections.

 - A zoning change was recommended for approval at the December 12 Planning and Zoning meeting.
 - Tracking for February 7 City Council meeting.
 - Purpose of replat and zoning is to construct an accessory structure to allow for hearse car parking.

• Ongoing:

- Comprehensive Plan Five-Year Update:
 - Planning and Zoning Commission is focusing on Opportunity Area 1 and Opportunity Area 8.
 - Staff recommendations for updates to the Zoning Ordinance will eventually become a part of this process.
- Short-Term Rental Registration Program:
 - Six final notices and four initial notices were mailed on August 2.
 - Three properties are going through the Specific Use Permit process.
 - One property is no longer operating as a short-term rental and four properties have registered as long-term rentals.
 - Four property owners have not responded.
 - Five properties were granted a Specific Use Permit by the Council.






