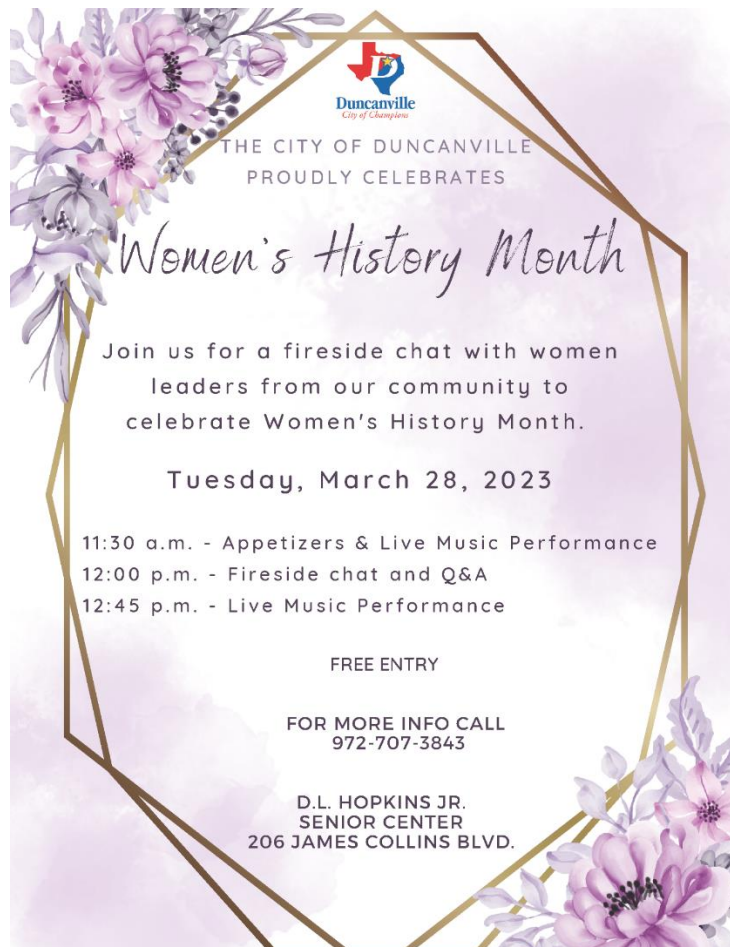

## **PARKS AND RECREATION**

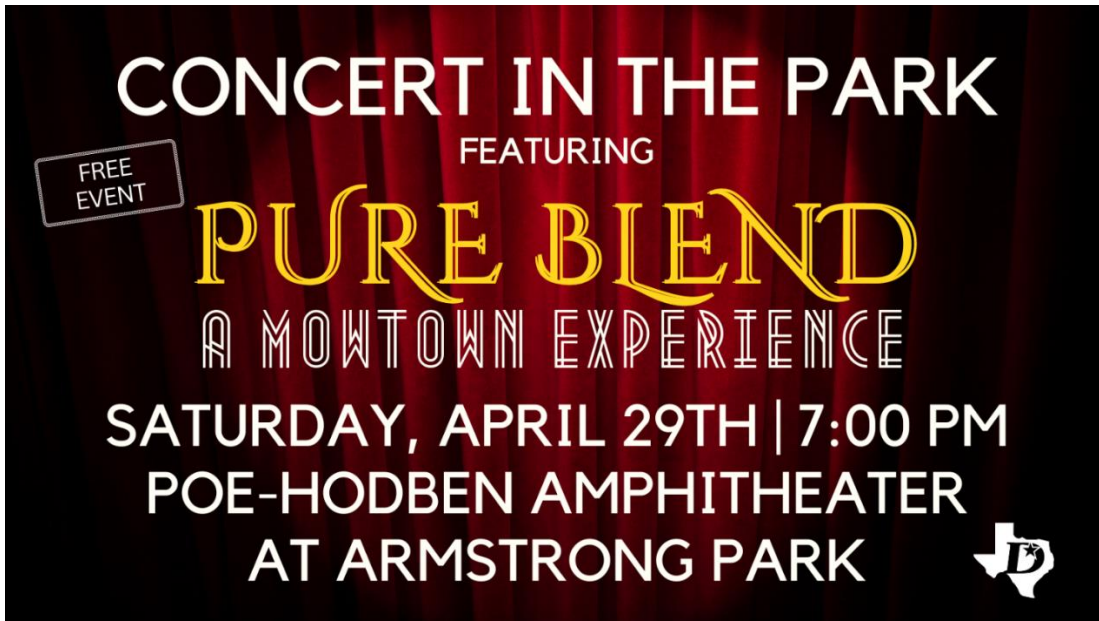

## **PUBLIC WORKS**

### **Operational Updates:**

#### **Utilities Division**

- Water usage was 27.461 million gallons during this reporting period, February 20-26, down from 28.842 million gallons the previous week. The daily peak water demand of 4.281 million gallons occurred on Saturday, February 25. There were 0.39 inches of precipitation during this reporting period.
- Eight hydrants were flushed and seven valves were exercised.
- There was an estimated water loss of 140,500 gallons.
- There was one service line and one hydrant repaired.
- Crews responded to four sewer backup calls and televised 67 feet of sewer line.

### Street Division

- Removed fallen trees, totaling five cubic yards, from the right of way on Lodema.
- Patched twenty-two potholes in various locations throughout the City.
- Repaired utility cuts on Willowbrook and Athenia Way.
- Inspected thirteen headwalls and found that none of them required cleaning.
- Responded to a callout request to remove brush on N. Merrill.
- Removed fallen tree limb from the street on Candlelight.
- Marked four right-of-way locates.
- Provided traffic control for the Heart of Duncanville 5K race.
- Saw-cut 840 linear feet of pavement at the new fire station.

## Sanitation Division

- The Solid Waste Division received three calls regarding the solid waste pick-up schedule and two regarding trash and recycling concerns. Twelve recycling bins were distributed to residents.

## CIP Construction:

- **E. Danieldale Rd. Reconstruction and Utility Improvements Project (Main St. to US-67)** – Subgrade is 99% complete. The Dallas Water Utilities water main passed BAC-T testing, and the final connection will be made this week. Lime treatment of the eastbound subgrade started on March 1, but has been delayed due to rain. Paving may be slightly postponed due to the cure time needed for lime treatment. PaveCon will notify affected residents and businesses of the nighttime paving and its impact. Nighttime paving is tentatively scheduled to begin on Monday, March 13, and will be done between 9:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m. Concrete placement for the sidewalks and turn lane will occur after the nighttime paving is complete and during regular working hours. Presently, to allow sufficient cure time for the concrete, the eastbound lanes of Danieldale Rd. are anticipated to open on April 24, 2023. All completion dates are approximate and can be delayed due to weather and supply issues.

- The Highway 67 Green Ribbon Construction Project** – Green Ribbon Project construction is substantially complete. Full completion, including seasonal planting, is scheduled for Spring 2023. The landscape monuments at Cockrell Hill Rd. and Highway 67 are complete. Both monuments are permanently illuminated.





- **Fire Station 271** – Council approved the Guaranteed Maximum Price agreement with CORE Construction to construct the new Fire Station 271 in June 2022. The Construction Kickoff meeting was held on August 10, 2022, and monthly progress meetings started on September 7. Construction has commenced. The Fire Station 271 Groundbreaking Ceremony is being rescheduled. The steel building was delivered on February 22 and is currently being erected. The fire line and water utilities have been connected to the City’s water main. Lastly, CORE is coordinating paving repair with the Streets Division. Completion of the fire station is slated for Fall 2023.

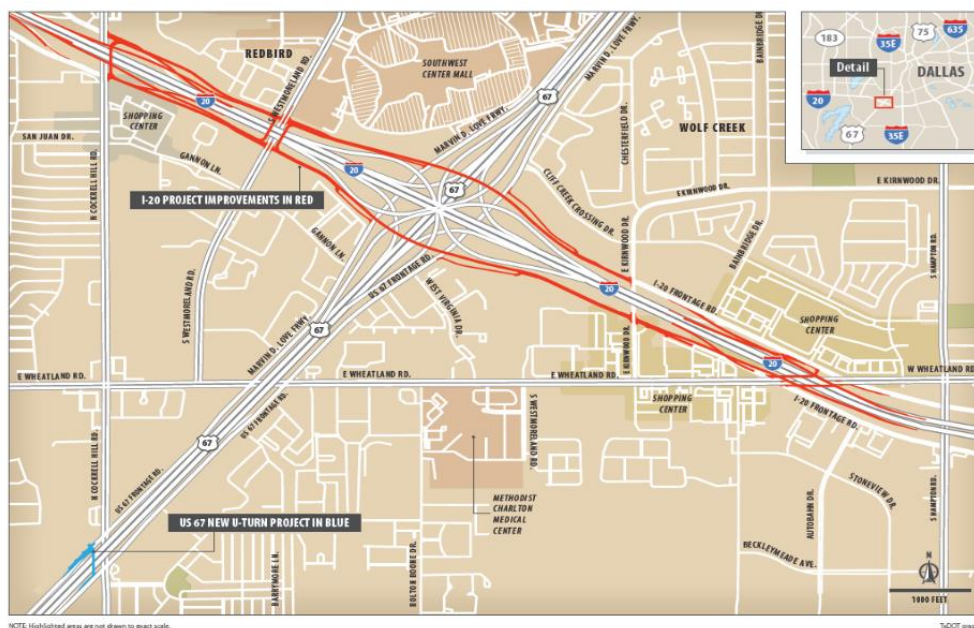


## Other Construction

- ONCOR Line Work in the vicinity of the Downtown District** – ONCOR is upgrading the electrical line along Daniel St., Main St., Center St., Freeman St., and Wheatland Rd. The upgrades will improve the electrical system’s capacity in that area. Work has commenced.



- TXDOT I-20 Construction Cockrell Hill Rd. to Hampton Rd.** – TXDOT plans to construct new service roads and ramps from Cockrell Hill Rd. in Duncanville to Hampton Rd. in Dallas to include new bridges across US-67. Following City Council Resolution in August, TXDOT will construct the US-67 Cockrell Hill Rd. Texas U-Turn on the southwest side of the bridge. The project was awarded at the beginning of December 2021. The Pre-construction Meeting with TXDOT and the contractor was held on February 1, 2022. Austin Bridge & Road, the contractor, started construction in April 2022, with an estimated completion date of January 2025. The Texas U-Turn at Cockrell Hill and Highway 67 is under construction.

### **Building and Inspection**

- A total of 1,866 single-family rental properties have been registered to date; one new property was registered since the last update. Twenty-five inspections were completed since the previous update; eleven passed and fourteen failed. The primary reasons for the failed inspections were absence of GFCI protection, as well as missing carbon monoxide and smoke detectors. A total of 1,356 Certificates of Occupancy have been issued since the inception of the Single-Family Rental Registration Program.
- Since the start of active lien collection in 2019, \$387,146.46 has been collected. \$15,127.19 has been collected since January 1, 2022. \$1138.08 was collected this week.
- This week 55 permits were issued, and 135 inspections were conducted. To date we have inspected 11 mobile vending units.

### **Neighborhood Services**

- Neighborhood Service Officers conducted 110 inspections, including re-inspections, and have 48 open cases.

### **Health Inspections**

- Our Health Inspector conducted thirteen inspections of food establishments and one pool/spa inspection.

  - A building permit application was submitted on November 18, 2022.
  - A meeting was held on January 9, 2023, to discuss further items required for issuing a permit.
  - A replat will be required. A replat application was submitted on February 16, and is scheduled for the April 4 Planning and Zoning meeting.



- New Development at 1203 North Cockrell Hill Road:
  - A pre-development meeting was held on February 6.
  - The civil plan was submitted on February 9 for pre-review prior to submitting the building permit.
  - No zoning will be required for the new building.
- Costco Fuel Expansion at 250 West Highway 67:
  - A pre-development meeting was held on February 7.
  - An updated site plan will be required when submitting the permit application; any new signage will also require permits.
  - Planning will require updated landscaping and photometric plans.
- New multi-family component, phase 2, at 402 W. Wheatland Rd.:
  - Approved by City Council on December 6, 2022, via Ordinance No. 2461.
  - A pre-development meeting was held on February 20.
- **Ongoing:**
  - **Comprehensive Plan Five-Year Update:**
    - The Planning and Zoning Commission is focusing on Opportunity Area 8, Ladd Property.
    - Due to severe weather, the first community meeting for the Comprehensive Plan was rescheduled. The new community meeting dates are:

  - **Short-Term Rental Registration Program:**

    - Four property owners have not responded.
    - Five properties have been granted a Specific Use Permit by the Council since July 2022.

- Lieutenant Emmett attended the District 2 Town Hall on February 20 and presented a brief update to the constituents in attendance.
- Assistant Chief Freis attended the monthly Faith Leaders breakfast hosted by First United Methodist Church.
- Officer Arias attended the Breakfast with Champions event at the Omni Dallas, hosted by Chief Eddie Garcia of the Dallas Police Department. This event recognizes athletes from the Special Olympics.

- Recruit Paul Becerra is in the Regional Police Academy.
- Officer Jessica Determan is in Field Training.
- Training and Personnel are conducting background investigations on applicants.
- We have nine openings for sworn personnel.



## **FIRE DEPARTMENT**

- The Fire Department responded to 131 calls for service in the past seven days, which included:
  - 96 EMS calls
  - 4 motor vehicle accidents
  - 2 structure fires
  - 2 passenger vehicle fires
  - 4 requests for assistance
- The Fire Prevention Division completed one inspection and one Certificate of Occupancy inspection, attended four pre-development meetings, conducted fifteen plan reviews, and performed five system checks.
- The Department has two vacancies. The new candidate started employment on February 27. The candidate will be in orientation and training for 4 to 6 weeks before he can be counted as staffing. Unfortunately, one of our valuable firefighter/paramedics has tested for the Plano Fire Department. He is number six on their eligibility list. The Department is working with Human Resources to schedule a new Civil Service Entrance Exam.
- Chief Rohde will be attending the Texas Fire Chiefs Executive Conference March 20-23, 2023, in Waco.

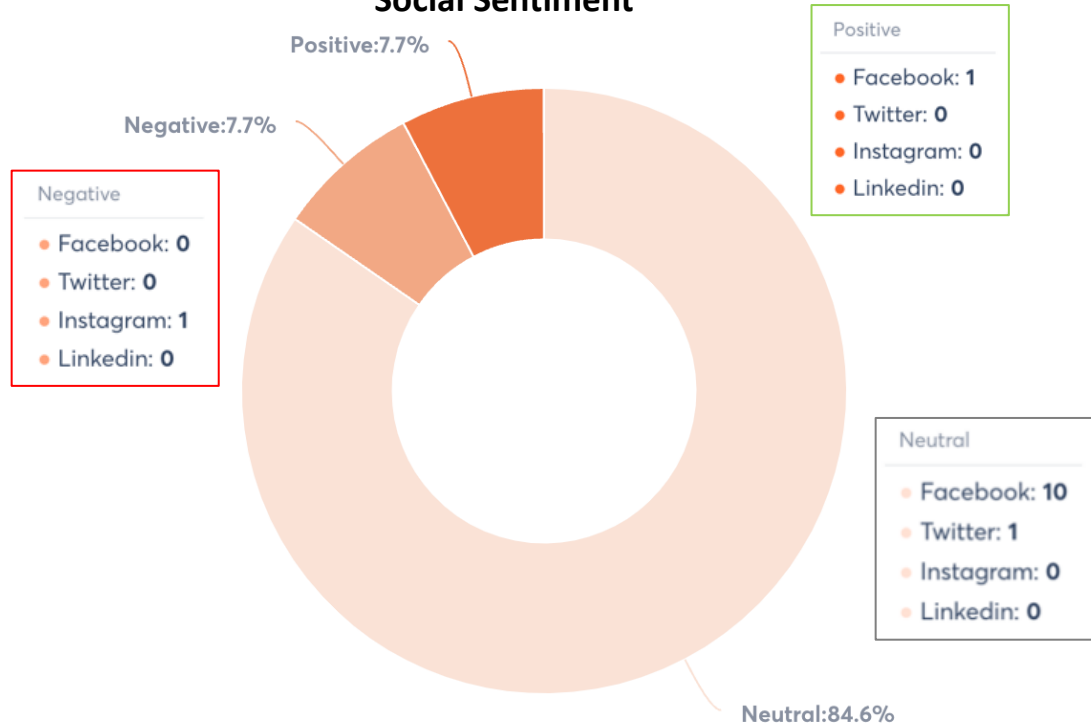
