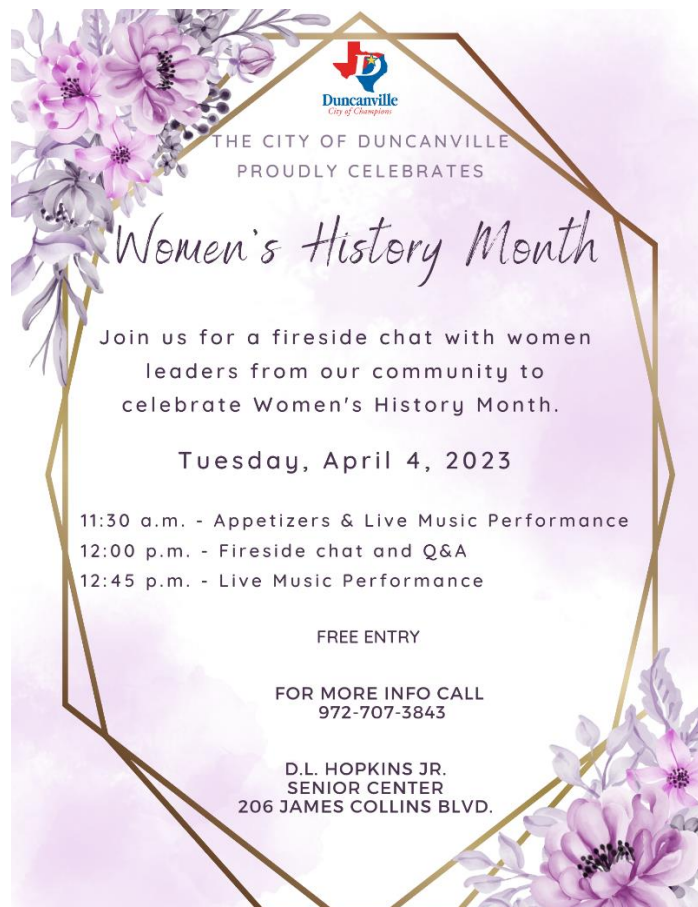

PUBLIC WORKS

Street Division

- Removed fallen trees, totaling fifteen cubic yards, from rights-of-way on Meadowglen and Hill City.
- Patched 57 potholes in various locations throughout the city.
- Inspected 53 headwalls: cleaned nine and removed nine cubic yards of trash and debris.
- Marked two right-of-way locates.
- Inspected 228 inlets: cleaned fourteen and removed nine cubic yards of trash.
- Removed the pavement and median on Camp Wisdom Road as part of the Fire Station 271 construction project.

Utilities Division

- Water usage was 27.821 million gallons during this reporting period, March 6-12, down from 31.699 million gallons the previous week. The daily peak water demand of 4.166 million gallons occurred on Saturday, March 5. There were 0.71 inches of precipitation during this reporting period.
- Twelve hydrants were flushed.
- An estimated water loss of 42,000 gallons occurred.
- Four hydrants were repaired.
- Crews responded to two sewer backup calls, cleaned 16,975 ft. of sewer line in WD Basin (The Greene), and 238 feet of sewer lines.

Solid Waste Division

- The Solid Waste Division received five calls regarding the solid waste pick-up schedule, three trash complaints, and two bulk complaints. Nine recycling bins were distributed to residents.

CIP Construction:

- **E. Danieldale Rd. Reconstruction and Utility Improvements Project (Main St. to US-67)** – The subgrade is 99% complete. The Dallas Water Utilities water main was inspected and passed by the Dallas Water Utilities inspector. Water line 4 testing is complete and ready to be put into service. The underground work for the project is now complete. Paving restoration of S. Main St. and Shady Trail is expected to be completed next week. The initial part of the lime treatment was completed on Friday, March 10, with 130 tons of hydrated lime mixed. The remixing process has not started. However, Public Works Engineering is encouraging the contractor to begin this week. The pre-paving meeting has been set for Monday, March 20, at 1:00 pm. The contractors, Public Works, Police, and Fire staff will attend the meeting. Nighttime paving has not been scheduled. However, we are working with the contractor to pave as soon as possible. Weather and overnight temperatures play a crucial role in scheduling paving. PaveCon provided a copy of the draft nighttime pour/traffic re-route notification letter to affected residents and businesses for the City's review. The letter will be distributed once the paving dates have been set.

- The Highway 67 Green Ribbon Construction Project** – Green Ribbon Project construction is substantially complete. Full completion, including seasonal planting, is scheduled for Spring 2023. The landscape monuments at Cockrell Hill Rd. and Highway 67 are complete. Both monuments are permanently illuminated.



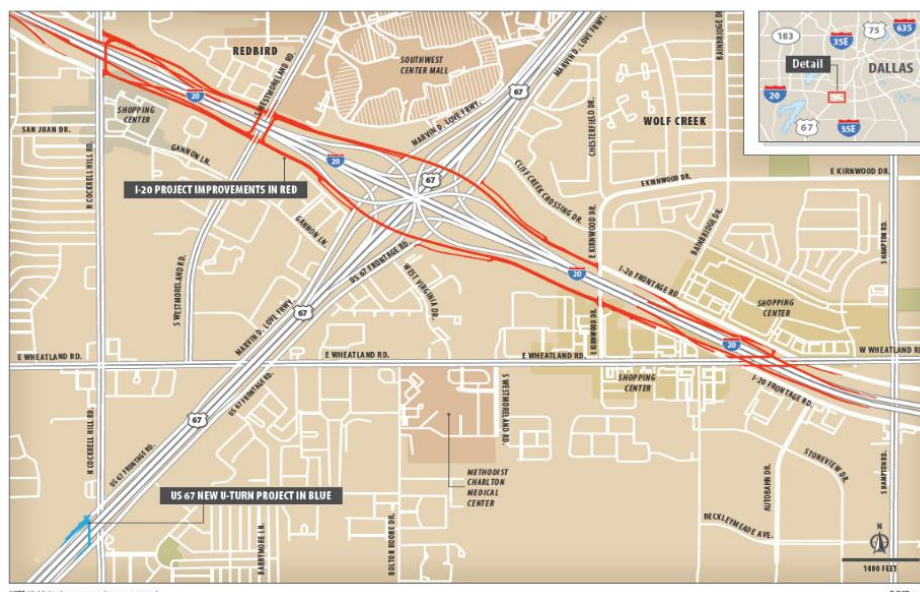
- Fire Station 271** – Council approved the Guaranteed Maximum Price agreement with CORE Construction to construct the new Fire Station 271 in June 2022. The Construction Kickoff meeting was held on August 10, 2022, and monthly progress meetings started on September 7. Construction has commenced. The Fire Station 271 Groundbreaking Ceremony is being rescheduled. City crews have saw cut and removed the concrete paving from E. Camp Wisdom, and started the layout for the new medians. The City has requested that Core provide survey points for the median placement. Completion of the fire station is slated for Fall 2023.

Other Construction

- **TXDOT I-20 Construction Cockrell Hill Rd. to Hampton Rd.** – TXDOT plans to construct new service roads and ramps from Cockrell Hill Rd. in Duncanville to Hampton Rd. in Dallas to include new bridges across US-67. Following City Council Resolution in August, TXDOT will construct the US-67 Cockrell Hill Rd. Texas U-Turn on the southwest side of the bridge. The project was awarded at the beginning of December 2021. The Pre-construction Meeting with TXDOT and the contractor was held on February 1, 2022. Austin Bridge & Road, the contractor, started construction in April 2022, with an estimated completion date of January 2025. The Texas U-Turn at Cockrell Hill and Highway 67 is under construction.



DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

Economic Development

- Clay Mansell, Economic Development Administrator, completed the University of Virginia LEAD (Leading, Educating, and Developing) program for local government leaders. The extensive week-long program connected resources, instruction, subject matter experts, and fellow local government practitioners to learn and develop skills and tools related to government leadership.
- Worked with the stakeholders of Project Jet to ensure a successful opening.
- Met with the owners of a local business to discuss redevelopment of a space for a potential restaurant.
- Met with the representatives of Project Cup to discuss site selection and expansion to Duncanville.
- Met with the owner of a key property that is a prime target for redevelopment.
- Worked with local brokers and developers to create space for retail and restaurants.

Building and Inspection

- A total of 1,869 single-family rental properties have been registered to date; two new properties were registered since the last update. Twenty-two inspections were completed since the previous update; eleven passed and eleven failed. The primary reasons for the failed inspections were absence of GFCI protection, as well as missing carbon monoxide and smoke detectors. A total of 1,365 Certificates of Occupancy have been issued since the inception of the Single-Family Rental Registration Program.
- Since the start of active lien collection in 2019, \$387,146.46 has been collected. \$15,127.19 has been collected since January 1, 2022.
- This week 64 permits were issued, and 105 inspections were conducted.

Neighborhood Services

- Neighborhood Service Officers conducted 132 inspections, including re-inspections, and have 57 open cases.

Health Inspections

- Our Health Inspector conducted ten routine inspections, two follow-up inspections, and two Certificate of Occupancy inspections.

- **New and Potential Projects:**

 - A preliminary meeting was held on July 12, 2022.
 - Proposed project is currently in the pre-development stage and staff has been meeting with developers occasionally throughout this stage.
 - New Development at 750 W. Camp Wisdom Road:
 - Planned development request was approved at the October 18, 2022 City Council meeting.
 - Plans have been approved by all departments.
 - A permit will be issued once the sub-contractors register.
 - A pre-construction meeting was held on February 15.
 - New Development at 704 N. Main Street:
 - The site plan was submitted on August 30, 2022.
 - A building permit application was submitted on November 18, 2022.
 - A meeting was held on January 9, 2023, to discuss further items required for issuing a permit.
 - A replat will be required. A replat application was submitted on February 16, and is scheduled for the April 10 Planning and Zoning meeting.

- New Development at 1203 N. Cockrell Hill Road:
 - A pre-development meeting was held on February 6.
 - The civil plan was submitted on February 9 for pre-review prior to submitting the building permit.
 - No zoning will be required for the new building.
- Costco Fuel Expansion at 250 West Highway 67:
 - A pre-development meeting was held on February 7.
 - An updated site plan will be required when submitting the permit application; any new signage will also require permits.
 - Planning will require updated landscaping and photometric plans.
- New multi-family component, phase 2, at 402 W. Wheatland Rd.:
 - Approved by City Council on December 6, 2022, via Ordinance No. 2461.
 - A pre-development meeting was held on February 20.
- **Ongoing:**
 - **Comprehensive Plan Five-Year Update:**
 - The Planning and Zoning Commission is focusing on Opportunity Area 8, Ladd Property.
 - The first community charette for the Comprehensive Plan was held on Thursday, March 9. Due to inclement weather, the March 16 community charette was postponed. The final community charettes will be held on Thursday, March 23, at 6:30 p.m. The charrette will take place at the Senior Center and there will also be an option to participate via Zoom. The Zoom charette will take place concurrent to the in-person charette.
 - **Short-Term Rental Registration Program:**
 - Six final notices and four initial notices were mailed on August 2, 2022.
 - Three properties are going through the Specific Use Permit process.
 - One property is no longer operating as a short-term rental and four properties have registered as long-term rentals.
 - Four property owners have not responded.
 - Five properties have been granted a Specific Use Permit by the Council since July 2022.

FISCAL SERVICES

- **Municipal Court** – Week of March 2 – March 8:
 - Dockets: 9 cases set for court.
 - Cases processed: 880.
- **Utility Billing:**

On March 14, 97 water disconnections were processed for cycle one customers with a past due balance. The Utility Customer Service Field Crew replaced three-meter lids customer one metered curb stop.

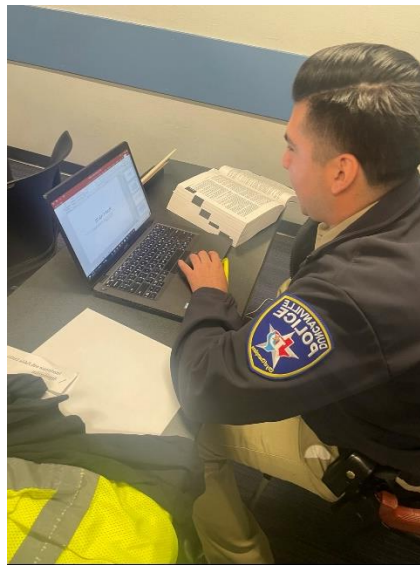
POLICE DEPARTMENT

PERSONNEL

- Training and Personnel are conducting background investigations on applicants.
- We have nine openings for sworn personnel.
- Training and Personnel conducted quarterly defensive tactics and de-escalation training with staff.
- Officer Jessica Determan is in Field Training.
- Recruits Rocio Vasquez and Ashley Garcia in the Dallas Sherriff's Office Police Academy.



- Recruit Paul Becerra is in the Regional Police Academy and expected to graduate on April 14.



COMMUNITY CORNER

- Officer Williams and Officer Arias attended Career Day at Reed Middle School, where they spoke to approximately 200 children.





FIRE DEPARTMENT

- The Fire Department responded to 110 calls for service in the past seven days, which included:
 - 81 EMS calls
 - 8 motor vehicle accidents
 - 1 cooking fire
 - 1 natural vegetation fire
 - 5 requests for assistance
- The Fire Prevention Division completed five inspections and five Certificate of Occupancy inspections, attended two pre-development meetings, conducted seven plan reviews, and performed four system checks.
- The Department has two vacancies. The new candidate started employment on February 27. The candidate will be in orientation and training for four to six weeks before he can be counted as staffing. Unfortunately, one of our valuable firefighter/paramedics has tested for the Plano Fire Department. He is number six on their eligibility list. The Department is working with Human Resources to schedule a new Civil Service Entrance Exam.
- Chief Rohde will be attending the Texas Fire Chiefs Executive Conference March 20-23, 2023, in Waco.
- Fire Marshal Blanchard will be attending the International Association of Arson Investigators March 27-30, 2023, in San Marcos.

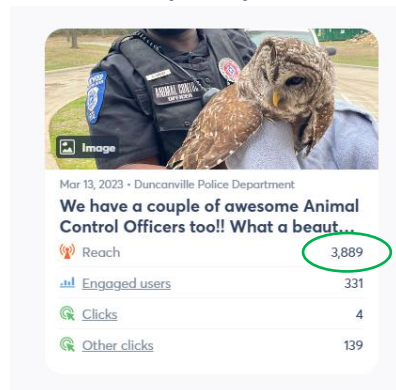
