PUBLIC WORKS

Street Division

- Removed fallen tree, totaling five cubic yards of debris, from right-of-way on Wishing Star.
- Patched six potholes on E. Center St. and W. Wheatland Rd.
- Repaired utility cuts on Swan Ridge and Roma.
- Inspected 228 inlets, cleaned 14, and removed six cubic yards of debris.
- Marked 13 rights-of-way in response to locate requests.
- Viking Construction continued micro-surfacing various streets throughout the city. The remaining work includes micro-surfacing pavement in the 1500 to 1700 blocks of Limeleaf and patchwork on Wren Cir. The FY23 micro-surfacing project should be completed on Thursday, April 13.

Utilities Division

- Water usage was 28.999 million gallons during this reporting period, March 27-April 2, up from 27.755 million gallons the previous week. The daily peak water demand of 4.432 million gallons occurred on Friday, March 31. There were 0.42 inches of precipitation during this reporting period.
- Ten hydrants were flushed, and six valves were exercised.
- An estimated water loss of 145,923 gallons occurred.
- Crews responded to six sewer backup calls and cleaned 4,125 ft. of sewer line in WD Basin (Greenbriar addition).

Sanitation Division

- The Solid Waste Division received one call regarding the solid waste pick-up schedule and three complaints (one brush, one code enforcement, and one special collection). Seven recycle bins were distributed to residents.
- Operation Clean Duncanville was held on Saturday, April 1, from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., at James Collins Blvd. and Armstrong Park. A total of 303 cars participated, as outlined below, with several vehicles attending more than one station.

CIP Construction:

- **E. Danieldale Rd. Reconstruction and Utility Improvements Project (Main St. to US-67)** – The subgrade is 99% complete. Nighttime paving on Eastbound Danieldale Rd., between Main St. and Highway 67, began on Monday, April 3, and was completed on Wednesday, April 5. 1,460 cubic yards of concrete were poured by machine and hand pour. Bob Lee Blvd., at the Duncanville Service Center, was closed on April 4, for paving improvements. It will be closed for at least 30 days. The Shady Trail entrance from S. Main St. was reopened after utility and pavement improvements. With Bob Lee closed, Shady Trail provides the only access road to the Service Center.

- **The Highway 67 Green Ribbon Construction Project** – Green Ribbon Project construction is substantially complete. Full completion, including seasonal planting, is scheduled for April or May. The landscape monuments at Cockrell Hill Rd. and Highway 67 are complete. Both monuments are permanently illuminated.



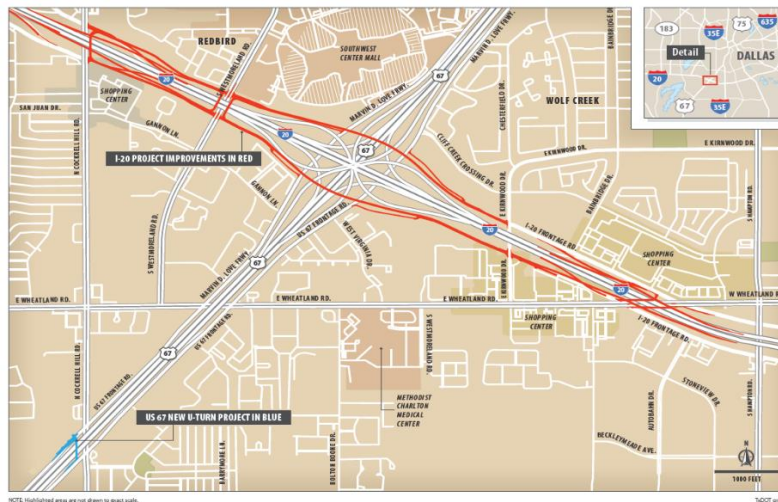
- **Fire Station 271** – Council approved the Guaranteed Maximum Price agreement with CORE Construction to construct the new Fire Station 271 in June 2022. The Construction Kickoff meeting was held on August 10, 2022, and monthly progress meetings started on September 7. Construction has commenced. The Fire Station 271 Groundbreaking Ceremony is being rescheduled. CORE Construction continues erecting the building and has completed the storm shelter. Completion of the fire station is slated for Fall 2023.

Other Construction

- **TXDOT I-20 Construction Cockrell Hill Rd. to Hampton Rd.** – TXDOT plans to construct new service roads and ramps from Cockrell Hill Rd. in Duncanville to Hampton Rd. in Dallas to include new bridges across US-67. Following City Council Resolution in August, TXDOT will construct the US-67 Cockrell Hill Rd. Texas U-Turn on the southwest side of the bridge. The project was awarded at the beginning of December 2021. The Pre-construction Meeting with TXDOT and the contractor was held on February 1, 2022. Austin Bridge & Road, the contractor, started construction in April 2022, with an estimated completion date of January 2025. The Texas U-Turn at Cockrell Hill and Highway 67 is under construction.



DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

Economic Development

- Created marketing material for DCEDC project efforts:
 - National Small business week 2023: April 30 – May 6.
 - City and DCEDC participation in projects and developments around town.
- Initiated implementation of project management tools for Development Services
- Began FY24 budget preparation for EDC, TIF, and HOT funds.
- Provided an incentive grant application to a business for design and beautification.
- Met with the representatives for a local retail center to discuss steps required to help a tenant come into code compliance.

Neighborhood Services

- Neighborhood Service Officers conducted 105 inspections, including re-inspections, and have 42 open cases.

Building and Inspections

- A total of 1,889 single-family rental properties have been registered to date; two new properties were registered this week. Twenty-seven inspections were completed since the previous update; eighteen passed and nine failed. The primary reasons for the failed inspections were absence of GFCI protection, as well as missing carbon monoxide and smoke detectors. A total of 1,397 Certificates of Occupancy have been issued since the inception of the Single-Family Rental Registration Program.
- Since the start of active lien collection in 2019, \$387,422.92 has been collected. \$15,403.95 has been collected since January 1, 2022, including \$276.76 that was collected this week.
- This week 77 permits were issued, and 117 inspections were conducted.

Health Inspections

- Our Health Inspector conducted eleven routine inspections, one inspection due to a complaint, and one Certificate of Occupancy inspection.

 - A preliminary meeting was held on July 12, 2022.
 - Proposed project is currently in the pre-development stage and staff has been meeting with developers occasionally throughout this stage.
 - New Development at 750 W. Camp Wisdom Road:
 - Planned development request was approved at the October 18, 2022 City Council meeting.
 - Plans have been approved by all departments.
 - A permit will be issued once the sub-contractors register.
 - A pre-construction meeting was held on February 15.

- New Development at 704 N. Main Street:
 - The site plan was submitted on August 30, 2022.
 - A building permit application was submitted on November 18, 2022.
 - A meeting was held on January 9, 2023, to discuss further items required for issuing a permit.
 - A replat will be required.
 - A replat application was submitted on February 16, and is scheduled for the April 10 Planning and Zoning meeting.
- New Development at 1203 N. Cockrell Hill Road:
 - A pre-development meeting was held on February 6.
 - The civil plan was submitted on February 9 for pre-review prior to submitting the building permit. Staff reviewed the plans and sent comments on March 22.
 - No zoning will be required for the new building.
- Costco Fuel Expansion at 250 West Highway 67:
 - A pre-development meeting was held on February 7.
 - An updated site plan will be required when submitting the permit application; any new signage will also require permits.
 - Planning will require updated landscaping and photometric plans.
 - Client intends to submit the building permit application soon.
- New multi-family component, phase 2, at 402 W. Wheatland Rd.:
 - Approved by City Council on December 6, 2022, via Ordinance No. 2461.
 - A pre-development meeting was held on February 20.
- New Development at 282 West Highway 67:
 - A site plan was submitted on March 31 and is being reviewed by staff.
- New Development at 215 Woodhave Blvd.:
 - A site plan was submitted on March 20.
 - Staff provided comments on March 28 and are waiting on the developer to submit revisions.
- **Ongoing:**
 - **Comprehensive Plan Five-Year Update:**
 - The Planning and Zoning Commission is focusing on Opportunity Area 8, Ladd Property.
 - University of Texas Dallas students are currently going through citizen submitted information obtained from community meetings and will be providing the City with a response once all information has been collected and organized.

- Recruit Paul Becerra is in the Regional Police Academy and expected to graduate on April 14.
- Officer Jessica Determan is in Field Training.
- Training and Personnel have exhausted the current civil service eligibility list.
- We will be hosting our next civil service exam on Saturday, May 20.
- We have nine openings for sworn personnel.

COMMUNITY CORNER

- Chief Mark LiVigni attended a legislative hearing in Austin concerning the elimination of Texas temporary paper license plates.
- Officer Michelle Arias and several C.O.P. volunteers conducted 166 BMV Report card surveys in the 400 block of E. Camp Wisdom Rd.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

- The Fire Department responded to 120 calls for service in the past seven days, which included:
 - 82 EMS calls
 - 5 motor vehicle accidents
 - 5 requests for assistance

- The Department has two vacancies. The new candidate started employment on February 27, 2023. The candidate will be in orientation and training for 4 to 6 weeks before he can be counted as staffing. Unfortunately, one of our valuable firefighter/paramedics has tested for the Plano Fire Department. He is number 6 on their eligibility list. The Department is working with HR to schedule a new Civil Service Entrance Exam.
- The Fire Deputy Marshal exam was administered on March 24, and the Fire Marshal exam was held on March 31.
- The Civil Service Commission has scheduled a public hearing for Monday April 10, to finalize the examination list ranking for promotion.
- The P25 portable radios have been delivered to the Department. The radios are in the process of being set-up for personnel to begin training on their function.
