

#### **Building and Inspections**

 1,910 single-family rental properties have been registered; three new properties have been registered since the last update. Twenty-one inspections were completed this week; ten passed, six failed, and four were canceled. The primary reasons for the failed inspections were the absence of GFCI protection and missing carbon monoxide and smoke detectors. 150 Certificates of Occupancy have been issued since the inception of the Single-Family Rental Registration Program.

- The Police and Fire Departments are actively processing candidates to fill vacancies within their Civil Service entry-level positions.
- The City onboarded eight employees this pay period: three full-time employees (Maintenance Worker Horticulture, Chief Procurement Officer, and Traffic Operations Technician) and five part-time employees.
- The new City Secretary will be starting on August 1.
- The Human Resources Department is preparing for the 2023-24 Open Enrollment period for benefits selection and enrollments for active and retired employees.
- Human Resources is preparing for in-house training for all supervisory personnel. The training will cover various topics to support existing HR policies and practices.
- The Human Resources Department is partnering with Public Works (Streets Division) to develop recruitment and retention strategies.
- Newly named Civil Service Commissioner Doug Sisk has been sworn in, and the meeting is being held for mid-August.



June Employee Spotlight

Jennifer Otey, Chief Innovation Officer

I have worn a variety of hats in my 18-year tenure with the City. My current position as Chief Innovation Officer was created in 2022 to oversee strategic planning and special projects for City management. Strategic planning incorporates the visions of the City Council, citizens, and staff to realize goals and actions that would ensure Duncanville continues to thrive for the next generation of residents, leaders, business owners, and staff.

Currently, I am tasked with overseeing the budget. Creating the budget is one of the most important activities a city engages in every year. In my role, I continue to seek best practices and implement standards with the presentation of the budget. In fact, we have received the Distinguished Budget Award four years in a row from the GFOA (Governmental Finance Officers Association).

Another aspect of my role this summer is that I am working with an intern from the University of Texas at Dallas. She is shadowing and assisting me through the budget process over the next few months. This is an excellent opportunity for her to gain hands-on experience and exposure to the municipal budget process.

#### **Utilities Division**

 Water usage was 45.541 million gallons during this reporting period, July 3 – July 9, up from 41.493 million gallons the previous week. The daily peak water demand of 6.452 million gallons occurred on Saturday, July 8. There were 0.05 inches of precipitation during this period.

- An estimated water loss of 49,000 gallons occurred.
- Fourteen fire hydrants were flushed this week.
- There was one service line repaired.
- Four fire hydrants were repaired, and one was replaced.
- Crews responded to one sewer backup call, repaired three sewer lines, and made one new sewer tap.

#### **Sanitation Division**

- The Sanitation Division received nineteen calls regarding the solid waste pick-up schedule and missed pick-ups (five trash, seven bulk, two brush, one recycle, one call center, and three Neighborhood Services).
- Republic Services continues its early start (6:00 a.m.) for residential trash and bulk collection. This schedule change went into effect on July 6 due to excessive heat and will continue until further notice.
- Republic Services is approximately three weeks behind schedule with brush/bulk collection. City staff met with Republic Services; representatives on Tuesday, July 11, to discuss an action plan for their backlog. Republic has pledged to devote additional resources and trucks to ensure all outstanding bulk and brush (excluding prohibited items) are collected. They are actively working to get back on schedule.
- Seventeen recycle bins were distributed this week.

#### **CIP Construction:**

• E. Danieldale Rd. Reconstruction and Utility Improvements Project (Main St. to US-67)

Grading, forming, and rebar for sidewalks continue; sidewalks are 90% complete. Road striping has begun, the overpass has been striped and bike lanes have been installed. The landscape subcontractor continues to lay out and install the irrigation system. One Eastbound and one Westbound Lane is open to traffic. Medians are still closed for continued landscaping work. Work continues tying in the ADA ramps.
