

PUBLIC WORKS

Street Division

- Reshaped open ditches at 100-200 W. Redbird Ln. to facilitate drainage.
- Repaired utility concrete sidewalk and curb/asphalt street on Willow Brook Cir.
- Removed fallen tree from right-of-way on Westminster Ave.
- Repaired twenty potholes at various locations throughout the city.
- Cleaned thirteen drainage headwalls at various locations throughout the City.
- Trimmed tree branches at northbound Santa Fe Trl. between Big Stone Gap Rd. and W. Vinyard Rd.
- Placed barricades at Lakeside Park at entrances and closures to assist Parks and Recreation with an event.

Utilities Division

- Water usage was 37.695 million gallons during this reporting period, September 25 October 1, up from 39.428 million gallons the previous week. The daily peak water demand of 6.278 million gallons occurred on Friday, September 29. There was 0.00 inches of precipitation during this period.
- An estimated water loss of 255,432 gallons occurred, including one water main break.
- Sixteen fire hydrants, nine hydrants were repaired, and six valves were exercised.
- Two new meters were installed.
- Crews responded to four sewer calls and cleaned 28,400 ft. of sewer line in the Timber Trail, Orchard, and Limetree area.

 The City of Duncanville implements irrigation restrictions annually from April 1 to October 31 per our Water Conservation Plan. These restrictions do not allow irrigation systems or yard sprinklers to be used between 10:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. Although there has been a period of continued hot and dry days, our water supply is sufficient to keep up with the current demand.

Sanitation Division

- The Sanitation Division received one call (collection services).
- Recycle bins have been requested from Republic Services. They are currently out of stock but will provide the bins when they become available.
- Swan Ridge Reconstruction and Beaver Creek and Shady Tree Place Waterline Replacement Project
 - SYB Construction continues to install water and sewer utilities on Swan Ridge. Bacteriological sampling of the new water main is underway. The 24-inch RCP storm line has been lined and is curing. SYB conducted the lime mixing on Saturday, September 30. Beaver Creek and Shady Tree community residents have been notified of the SYB mobilizing into the area. Water and sewer construction on Beaver Creek will begin on Monday, October 9.

• Fire Station #1

- Oncore has provided power to the building.
- Core is working with the City and BRW to install an irrigation system.



• Cherry Alley Phase 1

- The project will include reconstructing approximately 1,200 linear feet of alley pavement and needed drainage improvements in the alley between Cherry Street and Center Street, from Alexander Avenue to N. Cockrell Hill Road.
- The contractor has installed storm line piping.
- The general contractor discovered a conflict with a power line, and we are working with Oncor to resolve the issue. This item continues as we have uncovered the east half of the alley and found the primary power line was directly buried under the concrete.
- Stop Signs at I20 & Oriole TXDOT's consultant (Maldonado-Burkett) has completed the signal study for the intersection of IH 20 frontage roads at Oriole Blvd in the City of Duncanville, Dallas County. Based on the actual volumes, the intersection did not meet the signal authorization threshold. However, based on this engineering study, the IH 20 frontage roads at the Oriole Blvd. intersection meet the criteria for all-way stop conditions. The City Manager's Office has approved the installation of the signs. They will be installed during the first part of October 2023.

CIP Construction:

• E. Danieldale Rd. Reconstruction and Utility Improvements Project (Main St. to US-67)

PaveCon has opened all lanes of traffic; temporary traffic control is set as needed during working hours to perform the remaining work. Medians at E. Danieldale Rd. and Main St. have been poured. The veneer is scheduled to be replaced next. The street striping is 99% complete, and the concrete sidewalks have been completed along the handicap ramps. A final paving inspection will be completed next week.


NUMBER OF REQUESTS


