PUBLIC WORKS

Street Division

- Crews repaired a utility cut on Hayrowth Ave.
- Repaired broken concrete pavement on Power Dr.
- Crews marked two utility drainage locates.

- Installed and tested a sand spreader on one tandem truck in preparation for winter weather.
- Crews repaired nine potholes on Stanwyck Ave., Woodhaven Blvd., Beavercreek Dr., and Alexander Ave.
- Cleaned drainage creeks on Greenstone Ln., Santa Fe Trl., Chris Paris Park, and Harring Park.
- Staff installed ten removable safety cross bars drainage inlet entrances in the Thoroughbred Hills subdivision.

Utilities Division

- Water usage was 45.548 million gallons during this reporting period, November 6 November 12, up from 40.364 million gallons the previous week. The daily peak water demand of 7.972 million gallons occurred on Tuesday, November 7. There was 0.33 inches of precipitation during this period.
- An estimated water loss of 310,649 gallons occurred.
- Fifteen fire hydrants were flushed, and seven valves were exercised.
- One new meter was installed, and one service line was repaired.
- Crews responded to seven sewer calls.
- 96 feet of sewer lines were televised.

Sanitation Division

- The Sanitation Division received three calls this week (one scheduling, one trash, and one recycle) for Solid Waste collection services.
- Republic Services distributed one recycle bin this week.
- Swan Ridge Reconstruction and Beaver Creek and Shady Tree Place Waterline Replacement Project
 - SYB final water main connections on Swan Ridge have been completed.
 - Water services have been moved to the new water main.
 - Contractor is finishing sidewalks and driveways on Swan Ridge.

 Shady Tree and Beaver water main replacement is nearly complete. Testing is slated to begin after the Thanksgiving holiday.

Fire Station #1

- Core's landscape subcontractor is installing irrigation and plants.
- o Core is working to complete the interior finish.
- o Generator start-up is complete; testing will be scheduled.
- TV's for the EOC and living area have been installed.

• Cherry Alley Phase 1

- The project will reconstruct approximately 1,200 linear feet of alley pavement and needed drainage improvements between Cherry St. and Center St., from Alexander Ave. to N. Cockrell Hill Rd.
- Oncor has established a date of late November 2023 to complete their work and for construction to resume.

CIP Construction:

- E. Danieldale Rd. Reconstruction and Utility Improvements Project (Main St. to US-67)
 - Inspection by the Registered Accessibility Specialist Inspector for ADA requirements was completed; minor corrections are to be made by Pavecon.

 - Landscaping continues. We are working with the contractor to ensure all work is completed.
 - Handrail construction began November 8.




