Duncanville, TX - Duncanville Police Chief Mark LiVigni has announced his retirement after 30 years of service with Duncanville. His retirement will be effective January 31, 2024. The City of Duncanville invites the community to a celebration in honor of Chief LiVigni at City Hall, 203 E. Wheatland Rd., Duncanville, TX 75116, on Friday, January 19, 2024, from 1:30 PM to 3:30 PM.

Chief LiVigni, a United States Air Force veteran, began his career in policing in 1993 with the Duncanville Police Department. He has since served in every sworn rank during his 30 years of service.

"I had the honor of appointing Mark to Assistant Chief of Police in 2017. His work ethic was a shining example of what it means to be a dedicated law enforcement professional," said Assistant City Manager Robert D. Brown, Jr., who served as Duncanville's Chief of Police for 15 years. "I would like to thank him for his unwavering commitment to excellence during my tenure as Chief of Police. Mark will be missed."

"Chief LiVigni's dedication to the residents of the City of Duncanville and his long-time service to the community has left us all the better for his efforts. His unwavering commitment to public safety and the well-being of our citizens has been a hallmark of his service," said City Manager Douglas Finch. Building and Inspections

The failed inspections were due to the absence of GFCI protection and missing carbon monoxide and smoke detectors.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

 The Fire Department responded to 130 calls for service in the past seven days, which included:

- 110 EMS calls
- 3 building fires
- 2 passenger vehicle fires
- 1 rubbish fire
- 13 motor vehicle accidents
- 2 requests for assistance
- The Fire Prevention Division completed twelve inspections and attended two Pre-Development Meetings; thirteen plans were reviewed.

Investigations:

- Currently working on several investigations to build arson cases.
- Deputy Fire Marshal Training Progress:
 - Deputy Fire Marshall is now conducting inspections and limited plan reviews.
- The Department has two vacancies. The interview committee has scheduled interviews with the remaining candidates on the Civil Service list for January 26, 2024.
- The Department has one firefighter, EMT Mason Quinn, who is attending Paramedic School.

Assistant Chief Greg Chase attended the Second in Command Workshop in College Station January 15-17. The Texas Fire Chief's Association presents the workshop. The workshop's topics tackle common challenges encountered on the job and discuss innovations and strategies departments use throughout Texas.

Executive Assistant Lacey Freeman attended the Fire Administrative Professionals Workshop in College Station January 15-17. The Texas Fire Chief's Association presents the workshop. The conference aims to provide specific training and development opportunities to help connect FIRE/EMS administrative staff to provide the highest level of support.

PUBLIC WORKS

Street Division

- Crews repaired asphalt street pavement on Fairmeadows Dr., Greenway Cir. And Greenway Ct.
- Staff removed trees from right-of-way on Jungle Dr., Carder St, Hill City Rd., Danieldale Rd., and Camp Wisdom Rd.
- Repaired thirteen potholes on Center Street and Danieldale Rd.
- Crews prepared Fire Stations, Main Street, and intersections on Camp Wisdom Rd. and Cockrell Hill Rd. for winter storms.
- Duty Crew assisted Utilities Division with ice chat over icy pavements due to a water main break on Cockrell Hill Rd.
- Crews worked rotating 12-hour shifts Saturday morning through Tuesday to respond to the recent winter weather event.

Utilities Division

Water usage was 33.908 million gallons during this reporting period, January 8 –
 January 14, up from 31.3324 million gallons the previous week. The daily peak water

- demand of 4.2314 million gallons occurred on Saturday, January 13. There was 0.4 inches of precipitation during this period.
- An estimated water loss of 38,500 gallons occurred.
- Eleven fire hydrants were flushed, and two valves were exercised.
- Two new water meters were installed, three service lines were installed, and two hydrants were repaired.
- Crews responded to six sewer calls and cleaned 8,575 feet of sewer line.

Sanitation Division

- The Sanitation Division received six calls this week (one scheduling, two trash, one backflow, one bulk, and one recycle).
- Six recycle bins were distributed to residents.

CIP Construction

- Cherry Alley Phase 1
 - Oncor has completed its improvement, and alley construction will resume this month.

Swan Ridge Reconstruction and Beaver Creek and Shady Tree Place Waterline Replacement Project

 SYB is scheduled to return this week to complete the final water tie-ins and services at Beaver Creek and Shady Tree PI.

Fire Station 271

- CORE is working on completing the interior finishes. The fire station is 97% complete.
- o IT is wrapping up the installation of audio-visual and communication equipment.
- Staff are making provisions for perimeter fencing.
- East Danieldale Rd. Reconstruction and Utility Improvements Project
 - The project is substantially complete; staff is working with the contractor to complete all remaining items, including the monument lettering.

Other Construction

 TxDOT I20 Construction Cockrell Hill Rd. to Hampton Rd. TXDOT is constructing new service roads and ramps from Cockrell Hill Rd. in Duncanville to Hampton Rd. in Dallas, including new bridges across US-67. This project also includes construction by TXDOT of a Texas U-Turn at US 67 and Cockrell Hill Rd. on the southwest side of the bridge, which is projected to be completed by 2024, barring any unforeseen conditions. The entire project has an estimated completion date of September 2025.

Fieldhouse:



The Duncanville Fieldhouse is a valuable community asset that provides our area with opportunities for sports, recreation, social engagement, summer camp programs, and a sense of place. The facility encompasses a 115,000-square-foot indoor multipurpose sporting event, training, and education center, open from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. daily. Additionally, the facility is home to several small business entrepreneurs specializing in recreation, fitness, dance, and engagement. Currently, the City of Duncanville manages the facility, and its day-to-day operations are handled by city employees.

The City Council has been exploring options to enhance community engagement, offer more opportunities for utilizing the facility, and attract additional events for the greater benefit of our city and local businesses. On January 9, 2024, the Council authorized the City Manager to enter into an agreement with a private group to run the day-to-day operations of the facility with the goal of expanding services for our community.

In the coming weeks, City of Duncanville leadership will meet with the group and stakeholders to develop a transition plan for the facility and communicate these plans with our community and business partners at the Fieldhouse. At this time, we are just initiating the transition plan meetings, and we do not yet have a timeline to share. Please know that we highly value all stakeholders, businesses, and users of the Duncanville Fieldhouse, and we are optimistic that this new agreement and game plan will result in a winning formula for our City of Champions.




