# Inspections

- Property inspections are conducted to determine compliance with applicable state and local laws including, but not limited to, the current adopted International Residential Code and the current adopted International Property Maintenance Code.

# Automatic Failures:

- Inspecting for life safety issues is an important part of the inspection process and therefore failure to address the following issues will cause a property to automatically fail the inspection.
  - No vacuum breakers on hose bibs
  - No GFCI (ground-fault circuit interrupter) protection
  - No smoke/carbon monoxide detectors
  - Water heater temperature and pressure relief pipe running uphill
  - No combustion air for fuel burning appliance closets
  - No fire extinguisher

Vacuum breakers shall be installed on all hose bibs.

# No GFCI Protection

GFCI protection is required on kitchen countertops, in bathrooms, outdoor areas, unfinished basements and crawl spaces, garages, boathouses, and laundry areas.

# No carbon monoxide detector

Carbon monoxide alarms are required where there are gas fired appliances and/or if the unit has an attached garage that communicates with the dwelling. Alarms shall be installed per the manufacturer's specifications.

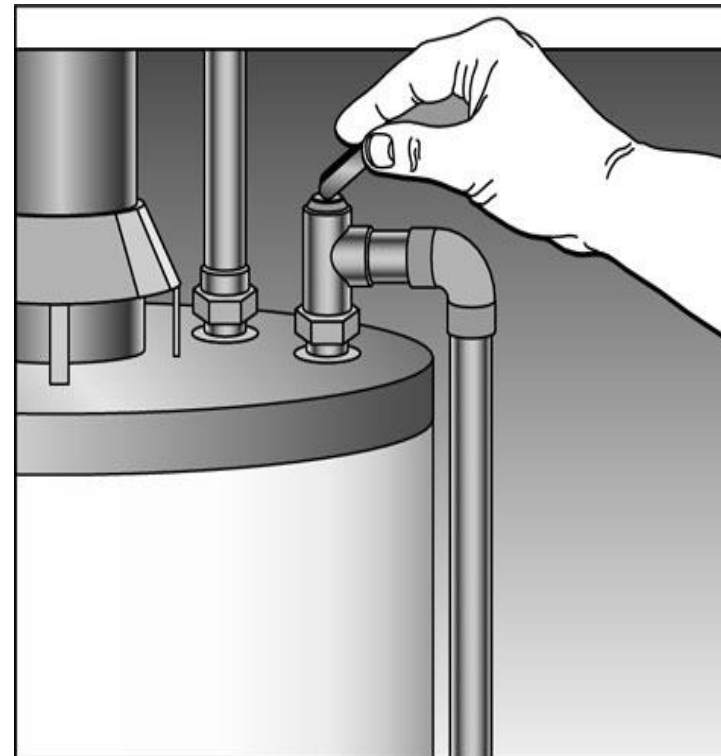
# T & P Relief Valve Running Uphill

T&P Drain Running Downhill

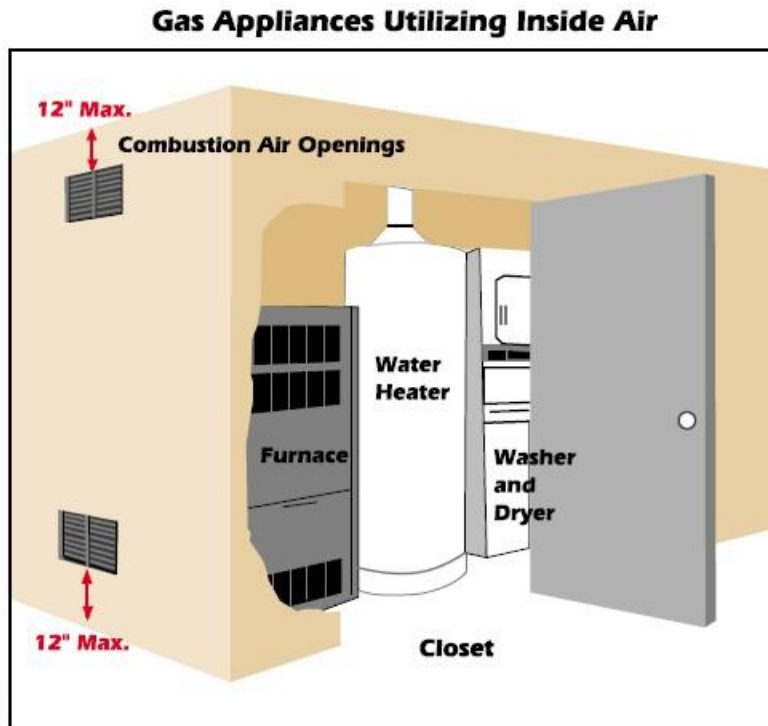




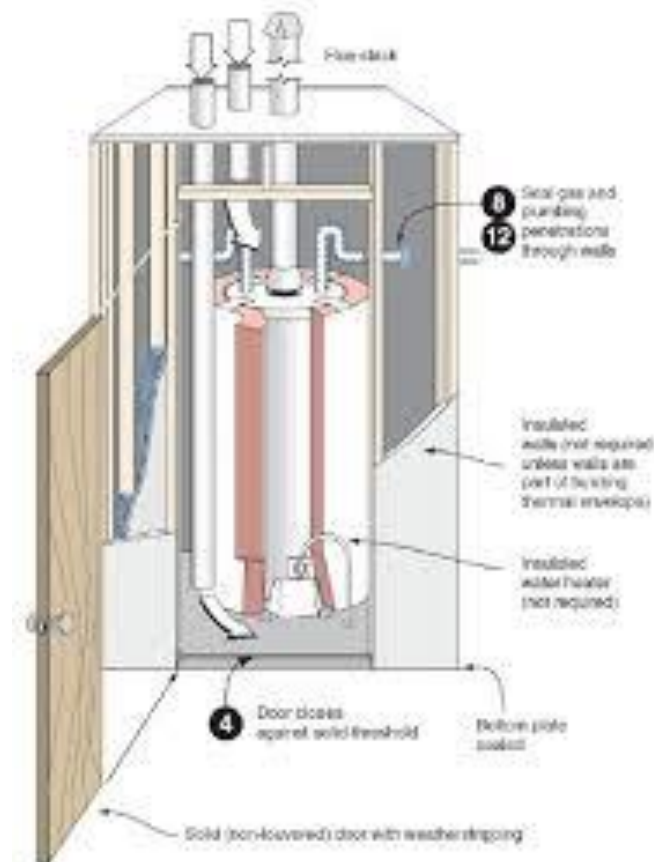
# No Combustion Air

# Fire Extinguishers

Each sleeping unit must have an approved 5 lb. residential fire extinguisher. Each kitchen must have an approved 5 lb. residential fire extinguisher.
